PROCLAIMING THE WORD OF GOD

Luke 19.11-27

¹¹ As they heard these things, he proceeded to tell a parable, because he was near to Jerusalem, and because they supposed that the kingdom of God was to appear immediately. 12 He said therefore, "A nobleman went into a far country to receive for himself a kingdom and then return. 13 Calling ten of his servants, he gave them ten minas, and said to them, 'Engage in business until I come. ¹⁴ But his citizens hated him and sent a delegation after him, saying, 'We do not want this man to reign over us.' 15 When he returned, having received the kingdom, he ordered these servants to whom he had given the money to be called to him, that he might know what they had gained by doing business. ¹⁶ The first came before him, saying, 'Lord, your mina has made ten minas more.' 17 And he said to him, 'Well done, good servant! Because you have been faithful in a very little, you shall have authority over ten cities.' 18 And the second came, saying, 'Lord, your mina has made five minas.' 19 And he said to him, 'And you are to be over five cities.' 20 Then another came, saying, 'Lord, here is your mina, which I kept laid away in a handkerchief; ²¹ for I was afraid of you, because you are a severe man. You take what you did not deposit, and reap what you did not sow.' 22 He said to him, 'I will condemn you with your own words, you wicked servant! You knew that I was a severe man, taking what I did not deposit and reaping what I did not sow? 23 Why then did you not put my money in the bank, and at my coming I might have collected it with interest?' 24 And he said to those who stood by, 'Take the mina from him, and give it to the one who has the ten minas.' 25 And they said to him, 'Lord, he has ten minas!' ²⁶ 'I tell you that to everyone who has, more will be given, but from the one who has not, even what he has will be taken away. 27 But as for these enemies of mine, who did not want me to reign over them, bring them here and slaughter them before me."

All: The grass withers, the flowers fade, but the word of our God will stand forever.


What grace is mine that He who dwells in endless light Called through the night to find my distant soul

What Robert Moffat saw and its impact

- A parable based in reality: the saga of King Archelaus
- The punchline for us: Engage until he comes

The Perspective of Time

- The Coming Kingdom
 - Now!
 - Expect Jesus to enter Jerusalem, be lifted up/accepted by the nation, crowned as king, and would reestablish the kingdom of Israel.
- The reality: Lifted up to die, crown of thorns, and a spiritual kingdom.
 - o Despite repeated proclamations, did not grasp the cross
- Already/Not yet
 - o A Time Delay
 - o The kingdom is not immediate....
 - o Jesus going away for an indefinite period of time

The Presence of Opportunity

- What are we to do? Cf. Luke 19.10
- Empowered Servants
 - o Followers of Jesus are entrusted with the Father's resources and are expected to engage in business
 - The King has high expectations of us
- Where our treasure is, there will our hearts be also.
- Our task is to reach the world with the proclamation of the gospel

The Persistence of Opposition

- Opposition to the King
 - Hostility towards Jesus and his mission will continue
 - Persecution
 - Obstruction
- The necessity of prayer

The Promise of the King's Return

- A day of joy
- Accounting
- Judgment
- A sense of urgency
