Sermon: "No Minor Judges, Prophets, or Christians!" - What's Wrong With You People? Pt. 39

I Text:

Old Covenant: Judges 12:8-15 New Covenant: John 20:24-29

II Doctrine:

Theologians refer to minor Prophets and Judges in the Bible, only regarding the size of their writings. These shorter books are not less relevant than the longer books in God's word. Would any sane person disregard the books of of Zechariah, Malachi or Habakkuk in their canon? We must treat the minor Judges the same way, their narratives are still significant today.

In the same regard there are no minor Christians in God's eyes. All those who believe and obey the Lord Jesus Christ are precious to the Lord. God understands the circumstances of the great unknown group of believers who live quiet and faithful lives. Obey the dictates of the great commission and you are mighty in God's kingdom.

The Lord Jesus Christ appreciates the fact you believe in him without physically seeing him. During your darkest days of temptation the Lord has never left you. Even as our world once again unravels, you will thrive in the aftermath. We must trust and obey, for there is no other way to be happy in Jesus!

This tragic story sums up the ignorance and debauchery of Israel during this period. The Evagelical Church around the world, has plunged into the same state of debauchery and ignorance concerning God's commands.

(*Matthew 28:16-20*)
- 3) The Lord Jesus Christ appreciates the fact you believe in him without physically seeing him. During your darkest days of temptation the Lord has never left you. Even as our world once again unravels, you will thrive in the aftermath. We must trust and obey, for there is no other way to be happy in Jesus! (*John 20:24-29*)
