


# WELCOME TO NEW CITY PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH


# LITURGY FOR THE PUBLIC WORSHIP OF GOD

As we gather to worship this morning, take a moment to reflect on the significance of our current liturgical season, as a way to prepare for our encounter with the living God.

### WORD ON WORSHIP

Palm Sunday

Palm Sunday is the celebration of Jesus' humble yet triumphal entry into Jerusalem, a week before his glorious resurrection. This Sunday inaugurates the Church's celebration of Holy Week; Jesus' last week of physically carrying out his earthly ministry. As Jesus and his disciples entered the city, a large crowd gathered around them praising Jesus in recognition of his messianic authority and royal status, placing their own cloaks and palm branches on the ground. The excitement grew with great expectation of what Jesus was there to do. The general crowd truly believed Jesus was the Messiah, but they were mistakenly assuming that he would immediately and completely establish his kingdom; an earthly kingdom. It's no wonder that the same people who were praising Jesus and shouting "Hosanna in the highest! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord!" were the same ones that in a few days would be shouting, "let him be crucified!" Despite this misunderstanding, their proclamation stood true and was glorifying to Christ, because it was time for his ultimate identity to be revealed. When the Pharisees sought to silence these proclamations, Jesus reproved them and answered that if everyone were to be silent, the very stones would cry out!



We celebrate Palm Sunday today, in light of Jesus Christ's glorious resurrection- the ultimate proof of who he is-knowing that his spiritual kingdom has been inaugurated, that he is ruling at the right hand of God, and that he will one day come again to gather his own for an eternity of true worship; where our declarations perfectly match our hearts and our Lord's. In recognition of his majesty we will once again get rid of our cloaks to be dressed in purity and we will wave palm branches in the air to acknowledge his eternal reign. God always comes to us before we can come to Him. Biblical worship is a response to God's gracious revelation of Himself, calling us to worship.

### WELCOME & CALL TO WORSHIP

<sup>5</sup> Have this mind among yourselves, which is yours in Christ Jesus, <sup>6</sup> who, though he was in the form of God, did not count equality with God a thing to be grasped, <sup>7</sup> but emptied himself, by taking the form of a servant, being born in the likeness of men. <sup>8</sup> And being found in human form, he humbled himself by becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross. <sup>9</sup> Therefore God has highly exalted him and bestowed on him the name that is above every name, <sup>10</sup> so that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, <sup>11</sup> and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

# THE PROCLAMATION OF GOD'S WORD

When we hear the Word of God proclaimed and preached, we are listening to the voice of God. The Holy Spirit makes the inspired texts and spoken words the chief means of nourishing and comforting God's people, and awakening others to new faith.

#### Matthew 21:1-11 (ESV)

<sup>1</sup> Now when they drew near to Jerusalem and came to Bethphage, to the Mount of Olives, then Jesus sent two disciples, <sup>2</sup> saying to them, "Go into the village in front of you, and immediately you will find a donkey tied, and a colt with her. Untie them and bring them to me. <sup>3</sup> If anyone says anything to you, you shall say, 'The Lord needs them,' and he will send them at once." <sup>4</sup> This took place to fulfill what was spoken by the prophet, saying,

<sup>5</sup> "Say to the daughter of Zion,

'Behold, your king is coming to you,

humble, and mounted on a donkey,

on a colt, the foal of a beast of burden.'"

<sup>6</sup> The disciples went and did as Jesus had directed them. <sup>7</sup> They brought the donkey and the colt and put on them their cloaks, and he sat on them. <sup>8</sup> Most of the crowd spread their cloaks on the road, and others cut branches from the trees and spread them on the road. <sup>9</sup> And the crowds that went before him and that followed him were shouting, "Hosanna to the Son of David! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord! Hosanna in the highest!" <sup>10</sup> And when he entered Jerusalem, the whole city was stirred up, saying, "Who is this?" <sup>11</sup> And the crowds said, "This is the prophet Jesus, from Nazareth of Galilee."

# AFFIRMATION OF FAITH

Heidelberg Catechism, Q.31

**Q.** Why is He called Christ, that is, Anointed?

**A.** Because He has been ordained by God the Father, and anointed with the Holy Spirit, to be our chief Prophet and Teacher, who has fully revealed to us the secret counsel and will of God concerning our redemption; our only High Priest, who by the one sacrifice of His body has redeemed us, and who continually intercedes for us before the Father; and our eternal King, who governs us by His Word and Spirit, and who defends and preserves us in the redemption obtained for us.

The Call To Repentance is an invitation to privately examine and prepare our hearts to confess our sins.

# THE SACRAMENT OF HOLY COMMUNION

Communion-also known as the Lord's Supper-has always been a common, shared, joyous family meal. This meal is for those who have placed their faith in Jesus Christ; for those Baptized Christians who trust in His once-for-all sacrificial death upon the cross for their salvation. When we celebrate this feast, we commune with the risen Lord Jesus who stands as our host to offer spiritual nourishment, renewal and life. We also commune with one another, participating together in the reconciling grace of God.

We warmly welcome to the table all who trust in Jesus and who have publicly professed their faith as members of a Christian congregation. At New City, we ask our children not to take communion until they have met with the elders to share of their faith in Christ, although all children are invited to come forward to receive a blessing and a word of encouragement. If you are not a Christian, we encourage you to spend this time reflecting on the prayers below in the hopes that a relationship with Jesus and membership in His Church may be considered.

You will be directed to make your way to one of the four stations in our sanctuary where you will receive the bread and the wine (gluten-free cracker and grape juice available). Please take it back to your place so we can partake together.

Jesus is truly and spiritually present and stands ready to feed you. Come hungry. Come thirsty. Come ready to be filled.
