# Living Under Submission

## A. General Principle: Submit to every ordinance of man 2:13

- 1. Submission to human authority in the Old Testament
- 2. Paul's teaching on submission—Romans 13
- 3. Identification of the "ordinances" of man as the institutions man has established to maintain order in God's creation.
- 4. Submission "for the Lord's sake"
  - a. When we obey earthly authority, we honor God's sovereign authority. Psalm 113:4; 22:8
  - b. When we obey earthly authority, we follow our Savior and reflects favorably upon Him. 1 Peter 2:23; Philippians 2:14

## B. Specific Practice: Human government 2:13-17

- 1. The God-ordained Purpose of human government 2:13-14
  - a. Punishment of Criminals
    - 1) Paul's teaching—Romans 13:3-4
    - 2) Noahic Covenant—Genesis 9:5-6
  - b. Praising of the good Citizens—Romans 13:3b-4a
- 2. Submission applied to all levels of authority
- 3. Are there exceptions to the rule of submission?
  - a. Modern day examples
  - b. If a law violates a clear command of God, we must obey God rather than man. For example
    - 1) Midwives in Egypt—Exodus 2
    - 2) Daniel and his three friends—Daniel 1, 3, 6
    - 3) Peter and John—Acts 4, 5
- 4. Why submit to human government?
  - a. It's God's way of silencing the gospel critics—2:15
    - 1) Titus 3:1-2
    - 2) "Doing good" more than being a good, law-abiding citizen. It is going beyond the call of duty. Luke 6:35
  - b. As "bondservants" of God, we should be intent on doing God's will.
    - 1) We are "free" in Christ
    - 2) But our "freedom" does not give us the right to disobey human authority, but to serve. Galatians 5:13
