- 1. Daniel 2 presents for the first time the outline of the program of God for the period of Gentile supremacy and chastisement of Israel.
- 2. Nowhere else in Scripture with the exception of Daniel 7 is a more detailed description given from the time of Daniel (600 years before Christ) to the second coming of Christ.
- 3. The record stretches from the decree to rebuild the walls of Jerusalem to the second coming of Christ.
- 4. Nebuchadnezzar had a dream and he recognized that this dream was important. (2:1)
- 5. The ancient Babylonians believed that dreams were messages from the gods so a right understanding of the dream was critical for their future.
- 6. In this case Nebuchadnezzar apparently feared that the strange revelation contained an ominous message for him.
- 7. The kingdom counselors are summoned to the king. (2:2-4)
- 8. Next we see the desperation of the counselors. (2:5-13)
- 9. The statement of the counselors in Daniel 2:10 wipes out astrology and other forms of human prophecy! Out of their own mouths they condemned their own practices.
- 10. Then in verses 14-16 we see Daniel's request for time to determine what the dream consisted of and also to seek an interpretation of the dream.
- 11. By delaying his obedience to the decree of the king Arioch was risking his own life. Arioch allowed Daniel time to speak to Nebuchadnezzar. (2:17-23)
- 12. Daniel's prayer of praise closed with thanks that God had revealed the king's dream to the four who had trusted Him.
- 13. The dream is explained to Nebuchadnezzar. (2:24-45)
- 14. Daniel's answer sets the matter in its proper light and gives God the glory. (2:25-30)
- 15. Before Daniel revealed the dream's contents, he reminded Nebuchadnezzar of the circumstances of the dream. (2:29)
- 16. Evident throughout this passage is the reality that true knowledge concerning spiritual matters and the future come only from God. (2:30)
- 17. Nebuchadnezzar's dream is revealed. (2:31-35)
- 18. The interpretation of the dream. (2:36-45)
