

Intro:

Main Point of Text: Moses veiled his face after talking with Israel to cover the fading away of the shine of God's glory.

Sermon Point: *Christ's Glorious Light Will Never Fade Away.*

Move 1: Moses' ministry of an earthly kingdom was full of glorious light – but it has died out.
Veils hide. What was Moses covering? Not the shining, but the fading: Vss. 30-32. In between talking with the people and going back to talk with God, he veiled himself: Vss. 33-35. Passing glory: Ex. 34:6. 2 Corinthians 3:7, 11, 13, 15.

Move 2: Jesus' ministry with the Kingdom of Heaven shines forever, brighter and brighter.
Moses ministry was glorious: vs. 29. But its shine was a shadow. Heb. 8:5-6 of Ex. 25:9: *Who serve unto the example and shadow of heavenly things, as Moses was admonished of God when he was about to make the tabernacle: for, See, saith he, that thou make all things according to the pattern shewed to thee in the mount. But now hath he obtained a more excellent ministry, by how much also he is the mediator of a better covenant, which was established upon better promises.* Christ's Kingdom is permanent, more glorious. Mt. 17:1-7. 2 Cor. 3:3-4, 7-11, 14, 17-18. Theocracy faded out. The glow of the Kingdom of Heaven only grows:

- 1 Pet. 1:3-4: *Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, which according to his abundant mercy hath begotten us again unto a lively hope by the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead, To an inheritance incorruptible, and undefiled, and that fadeth not away, reserved in heaven for you,*
- 1 Pet. 5:4: *And when the chief Shepherd shall appear, ye shall receive a crown of glory that fadeth not away.*
- Psalm 132: 11, 13, 17-18
- Rev. 21:13 fulfills Isa. 60:19-20
