- **I. D**ecisions "I have no commandment...judgment" (vs. 25-28) *Concerning the:*
 - A. Daughters "Now concerning virgins"
 - B. Difficult "seek not to be loosed"
 - C. Divorced "Art thou loosed from a wife"
- II. Devotion "how he may please the Lord" (vs. 28-33)

 Concerning our:
 - A. Suffering "Nevertheless such shall have trouble"
 - **B.** Stewardship "cares for the things that belong to the Lord"
 - C. Service "cares for the things that are of the world"
- III. Distraction "attend the Lord without distraction" (vs. 34-35)

 Concerning:
 - A. Commitment -"be holy both in body and spirit"
 - **B.** Caring "cares for the things of this world"
 - C. Comeliness "how she may please her husband"
