- 1. Timothy was a true disciple of the Lord Jesus Christ.
  - a. The Lord used the \_\_\_\_\_\_ that his mother and grandmother taught him to give Timothy the wisdom that led to salvation through faith in Christ.

- 2. Paul determined that it was prudent to circumcise Timothy to better facilitate ministry to the Jews.
