## II. Jesus encounters two apparently hopeless situations. 8:41-43

- A. Jairus pleads with Jesus to heal his dying twelve-year-old daughter. v. 41-42
  - 1. It is very unusual that a Jewish leader would humbly approach Jesus for help. v. 47 5:12,21,30 6:7 9:22 11:53 12:11 John 3:1ff
  - 2. Jairus' only begotten daughter is dying. 7:12 John 1:14,18 3:16 Heb. 11:17
  - 3. He believes that Jesus must come quickly to his house. 7:1-10,11ff
  - 4. The delays caused by the crowd and by the sick woman must have been agonizing for Jairus. v. 42b-48
- B. The woman with a hemorrhage has suffered for twelve years. v. 43
  - 1. Her health was ruined.

  - 3. She had suffered at the hands of many unhelpful physicians. Mark 5:26
  - 4. She was also ruined financially. Mark 5:26
- C. Trouble drives us to the Lord. Ps. 50:15 119:71
- D. The woman's pursuit of salvation from her physical malady is a picture of how people typically seek spiritual salvation.
  - 1. Many have suffered at the hands of many false spiritual doctors (Law, Morality, Do-Good, Ceremony, Ascetic, Feel-good, Orthodoxy). Rom. 3:20 Phil. 3:2ff
  - 2. These quacks leave their patients worse off spiritually and financially.

# III. Jesus cures the hopeless woman. v. 44-48

- A. She tries to steal a cure. v. 44
  - 1. She sneaks up through the crowd and touches the fringe of Jesus' cloak.
  - 2. Immediately she is cured. Acts 5:14 19:11-12
  - 3. Why aren't all of the other people who crowded up against Jesus cured? v. 48
- B. Jesus call her out. v. 45-46
  - 1. Does Jesus know who touched Him? 2:52 Mt. 24:36 Heb. 5:8
  - 2. Why does he ask?
  - 3. What do you think of Peter's answer?
- C. She gives testimony to what Jesus as done. v. 47 Mt. 10:32-33 Ro. 10:9
- D. Jesus sends her away in peace. v. 48 7:50
  - 1. What is the significance of Jesus calling her "daughter"? 8:21 Mt. 12:20
  - 2. In what sense did her faith save her? 17:19 18:42
    - a. Her faith was not the effectual cause of the cure.
    - b. It was the object of her faith which saved her. 17:5-6 Mark 9:24
  - 3. Must faith be present in order for Jesus to heal? 7:14ff 8:29ff
  - 4. Will Jesus always provide physical healing if we just have enough faith? 2 Co. 12:1-10 2 Tim. 4:20
  - 5. She now has peace. 7:50 Jo. 14:27

- E. What happened to her physically is a picture of what happens to us spiritually. v. 48
  - 1. After all other physicians had failed, we hear about the Great Physician and seek Him out. Mark 5:27 Rom. 10:17 Acts 4:12
  - 2. Salvation comes through making a connection with Jesus by faith. Eph. 2:8-9
  - 3. We are saved immediately when we believe. Acts 16:31 John 3:14-15
  - 4. Then Jesus calls us to give public testimony to what He has done for us. 9:26 Rom. 10:9 Mt. 10:32-33 1 Jo. 2:29
  - 5. We are now His sons and daughters and have peace. John 1:12-13 Ro. 5:1-2

# IV. Jesus raises the dead girl. v. 49-56

- A. Do not fear, only believe. v. 49-50
  - 1. It appears that Jesus is too late. v. 49 John 11:6,21
  - 2. Jesus stirs Jairus to faith. v. 50 Mt. 9:18 John 11:4
- B. Jesus enters the house. v. 51-53
  - 1. Why does He allow only three of the disciples to accompany Him? v. 51 9:28 Mark 14:33 Mt. 17:1 26:37 Gal. 2:9
  - 2. The mourners mock Him. v. 52-53 24:10-11 Gen. 18:12 Acts 17:32 Mt. 9:23
  - 3. In what sense is the girl asleep? John 11:11-14 1 Th. 4:13-17 Acts 7:60
- C. Jesus raises the girl from the dead. v. 54-56
  - 1. He touches her, again exposing Himself to uncleanness. Num. 19:11 Acts 9:41
  - 2. He speaks and listening to His voice new life the dead receive. v. 54-55a 7:14 9:22
  - 3. Her spirit returns to her body.
  - 4. Why does Jesus tell them to feed her? v. 55
  - 5. Why does Jesus tell the parents not to tell others what happened? v. 56 8:39 John 6:15,26
- D. What is the significance of this miracle?
  - 1. Jesus has power over death because He is the conqueror of death. 1 Co. 15:50-58 Heb. 2:14-15 9:27 2 Tim. 1:10 John 6:47 11:25-26
  - 2. When we were spiritually dead in sin Jesus made us alive. Eph. 2:1ff
  - 3. Physical death is but a sleep from which we will awake. <u>2 Co. 5:8</u> <u>1 Th. 4:13ff</u> 5:10 Phil. 3:20-21 1:21-23 Acts 7:59-60 1 Co. 15:6,18,20,51 Rev. 6:9ff John 5:28-29
  - 4. We too are mocked for our belief in Jesus' power to raise the dead. Acts 17:32
  - 5. We too must learn to trust God. v. 50 Isa. 26:3-4 43:2 Ps. 27:1ff
