The ultimate King comes as the ultimate Servant.

1.	The	Tragedy	of the	Event
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Tragic:

- (1) Because of the almost universal unbelief of Israel
- (2) Because we are witnessing Israel's judgment sealed
 - cf Lk. 19:41-44 "If you had known... You did not recognize the day of your visitation"
- (3) Because of the religious leaders' rejection of Christ
- (4) Because of the fickleness of the multitude

2. The Majesty of the Event

- (1) The Majesty of the event seen in Authenticating Signs
 - -1- The entrance upon a colt (1-7)

"Behold, your King is coming to you, Lowly, and sitting on a donkey,

- Omniscience

A colt, the foal of a donkey."

- Power
- True identity the Scriptures fulfilled to the letter (Zech. 9:9)
- -2- The praise of the people (8-11)
 - Portions of Ps. 118 chanted
 - on certain of the most solemn festivals
 - "Son of David" designation for Messiah!

"Hosanna to the Son of David! Blessed is He who comes in the name of the LORD! Hosanna in the highest!"

-3- The cleansing of the temple (12-13)

"It is written,

- Is. 56:7
- Jer. 7:11

'My house shall be called a house of prayer,'
but you have made it a 'den of thieves.' "

-4- The healing of the lame and blind (14)

- cf. Matt. 11:5 (Is. 29:18; 35:4-6)

-5- The praise of the children (15-16)

- Ps. 8:2

"Out of the mouth of babes and nursing infants You have perfected praise"

- (2) The Majesty of the event seen in Its Deeper Meaning: Its Gospel Significance
 - -1- Our Lord Jesus approaches as He had departed centuries before.
 - cf. Ezekiel's vision and the departure of the Shekinah glory Ezek. 10-11
 - Who approaches? The Lord of glory!
 - -2- Our Lord Jesus Servant of all
 - -3- The Unfolding of God's sovereign plan
