What do the prayers of the saints have to do with the trumpet judgments?	
The believer has been commanded to pray the Lord's Prayer which includes, <i>Thy kingdom come, Thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven.</i> The trumpets are announcing that God is about to answer this prayer and people need to get ready.	
The Fire Alarms: Revelation 8:7-9:19	
	7 <sup>th</sup> Seal: 7 Trumpets (Revelation 8:1-2)
i	What can a 'trumpet' do? Announce a warning of impending danger (like an alarm) or impending rescue (like the coming of the calvary). Its purpose is to get people's attention and often to sound an alarm. – Ezekiel 33:1-5, 11
	1st Trumpet: Increased Natural Disasters (also that due to war) – Revelation 8:7

	2 <sup>nd</sup> Trumpet: Increased Societal and Political Unrest and Chaos (including the rise of the One World Government) – Revelation 8:8-9

	3 <sup>rd</sup> Trumpet: Increased Economic and Basic Resource Issues (including the rise of the Anti-Christ) – Revelation 8:10-11

  □ 5<sup>th</sup> Trumpet: Unprecedented Demonic Oppression of Unbelievers (physical and psychological torment and distress) Revelation 9:1-12

  □ 6<sup>th</sup> Trumpet: Unprecedented Lawlessness (with genocide and incredible loss of life under the effects of unrestrained evil) Revelation 9:13-19

## Implications and Applications

Be Alert! (Luke 21:28-36)

- 1. God is sovereignly working out His plan, but we should never doubt the role prayer plays in the purposes of God. (8:3-4)
- 2. God warns and we need to heed the warnings in Scripture and in life. (8:6)
- 3. God brings judgment on a sinful world, but we can rest in the truth that nothing can truly hurt a believer in Jesus. (9:4)
- 4. God is sovereign over life and death and our efforts toward life or death are under His hand. (9:6)
- 5. What is happening on the world stage is determined by what is happening behind the scenes in the heavens. (9:14)
- 6. God sends warnings of judgment to lead us to repentance. (9:20-21)
- 7. God is leading us to repent of the worship of idols ('God-substitutes') and the sin against one another it causes. (9:20-21)
- 8. Our greatest need is repentance (turning to God for help and happiness); God's primary purpose in our circumstances is repentance, whether through *kind kindness* or *severe kindness*.

These kinds of Bible passages are intended to alarm us, not out of our wits, but into them!
