Jesus before three Jewish Judges in His trial:

I. JESUS BEFORE ANNAS John 18:12-14, 19-24

Putting yourself in the scene

3 main characters: Annas - his official - Jesus

- I. Annas sees Jesus as an intrusion
 - A. To his corrupt power
 - B. To his ill-gotten wealth

He must get rid of Jesus, so he asks about His

- a) disciples & b) doctrine implying that He is building a seditious cult
- II. Jesus' simple response
 - A. Not defensive
 - B. Points out the obvious truth, whatever the consequences (Note contrast: surrounded by Peter's **denial** of truth inconvenient to his well being)
- III. The official sees Jesus as an embarrassment
 Jesus has made them look foolish. Truth does that to liars
 So he strikes Jesus
 --in frustration and anger
 --to intimidate Him
- IV. Jesus' simple response
 - A. He does not "lose it"
 - B. He asks a gentle probing question: why?

So what

 Today's angry attacks on Jesus: Christianity is a self-deluded hoax Generally do not attack Jesus

- 2. How should we respond:
 - a) Not defensive He's a pattern to follow in conflict
 - b) Simply lay out historical facts and truth
 - c) Ask probing questions addressed to the heart
- 3. What is your position on Jesus??
 - a) Is He inconvenient to your lifestyle?
 - b) Is He a frustration in the things He brings to you?
 - c) Do you recognize your need of Him to:
 - forgive your sins
 - change your heart so you follow Him eagerly
