the centurions and said, "Get ready two hundred soldiers, with seventy horsemen and two hundred spearmen to go as far as Caesarea at the third hour of the night. 24 Also provide mounts for Paul to ride and bring him safely to Felix the governor." 25 And he wrote a letter to this effect: 26 "Claudius Lysias, to his Excellency the governor Felix, greetings. 27 This man was seized by the Jews and was about to be killed by them when I came upon them with the soldiers and rescued him, having learned that he was a Roman citizen. 28 And desiring to know the charge for which they were accusing him, I brought him down to their council. 29 I found that he was being accused about questions of their law, but charged with nothing deserving death or imprisonment. 30 And when it was disclosed to me that there would be a plot against the man, I sent him to you at once, ordering his accusers also to state before you what they have against him." 31 So the soldiers, according to their instructions, took Paul and brought him by night to Antipatris. 32 And on the next day they returned to the barracks, letting the horsemen go on with him. 33 When they had come to Caesarea and delivered the letter to the governor, they presented Paul also before him. **34** On reading the letter, he asked what province he was from. And when he learned that he was from Cilicia, 35 he said, "I will give you a hearing when your accusers arrive." And he commanded him to be guarded in Herod's praetorium. (ESV)



## Application Questions

- 2. Read Revelation 11:15-18 and Philippians 3:17-21. How does Christ's sovereign power, which will be fully exercised in the future, help you with the news headlines about corruption both in the church and in politics?
- 3. Read Daniel 3:16-19 and Acts 4:18-21. What kind of boldness and for what sorts of situations do you think our generation of Christians (and the ones to follow) might need to prepare mentally and spiritually?
- 4. Read 1 Timothy 2:1-4; Proverbs 21:1 and Daniel 4:28-37. How does the reality of the Proverbs truth and the example in Daniel motivate you to obey the directive in 1 Timothy 2:1-4?
- 5. Read 1 Chronicles 29:10-13 and Psalm 112:6-8. How can a high view of God, along with regular and consistent expressions of worship keep your heart and your mind steady in our tumultuous culture?
