Exodus 20:1-3

- I. Why we are to have no other gods than God
 - A. "Why then the law? It was added because of transgressions" (Galatians 3:19)
 - B. The two great commandments (Matthew 22:35-40)
 - C. "I am the Lord your God, who brought you out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of slavery." (20:2; see also Shorter Catechism Q&A 44; Luke 1:74-75; 1 Peter 1:14-19)
 - D. Because God is one, and sovereign, and self-existent, we ought to have no other gods
 - E. Because God is *our* God, we ought to have no other gods (see Ephesians 2-3)
 - F. Because God has redeemed us, we ought to have no other gods
- II. What it means to have no other gods
 - A. "You shall have no other gods before me." (20:2; see 20:20; 34:6)
 - B. Having other gods is seldom conscious or intentional (in this culture)
 - i. ancestors, other deities, prayers to saints are a giveaway
 - ii. whenever something takes on ultimate importance in your life, it is your god
 - iii. Having other gods is the root of every sin
 - iv. Having other gods is a description of the first sin (Genesis 3)
 - C. Doing bad things and feeling bad: evidence of other gods
 - i. The god of approval, respect, or love of others
 - ii. The god of physical comfort or pleasure
 - iii. The god of power or success
 - iv. "Root and fruit"
 - D. Having no other gods = there is nothing and no one of ultimate importance to you except God
- III. How to have no gods but God
 - A. Identify your other gods
 - B. Kill your other gods (see Exodus 32; Leviticus 9:2)
 - C. Fall in love with God
