### Bless God for Redeeming You! Ephesians 1:7-12

Reading: 1 Thessalonians 2:13-20 (Allen S.)

#### ...pray...

The approximate *population* of the planet is currently **7** billion souls.

Of those **7** billion, the United Nations estimates that at least **30** million live in slavery. The modern slave trade is a huge & insidious industry.

But the *Bible* guarantees that absolutely *everyone* is born into *slavery*…!

Spiritual slavery.

For which there is only **one** *hope*.

But it is *great hope*!

#### Let's return to Ephesians 1... read vv.3-14 (focus on vv.7-12).

Maybe this was Paul's opening worship song – like our call to worship!

We do know it's one of Paul's best loved long sentences. Yup, this is all just one long sentence -202 Gr. words. And it's pretty difficult to dissect!

But you *can* organize it into 3-stanzas:

#1 – The blessings by the *Father*.

#2 – The blessings in the *Son* 

#3 – The blessings thru the *Holy Spirit*.

Every stanza ends with a reference to the praise of the glory of [God.]"

Last Sunday we examined Stanza 1 – the blessings of election ( $\Rightarrow$  election, predestination, adoption, depravity) & therefore the goal of worship  $\Rightarrow$ "to the praise of the glory of His grace."

This morning we'll unpack *Stanza* **2** – the blessings of *redemption*, *revelation*, & our *inheritance* – again, all *to the praise of His glory*!

The best blessings you have were purchased by the blood of Jesus!

- 1. The precious price of our blessings (v.7 & 8).
- 2. The rich blessings of our salvation (vv.8-11).
- 3. The blessed goal of our redemption (v.12).

# Our blessings are *free*, but they aren't *cheap*! Paul writes of the precious price of *redemption* (v.7 & 8).

- 1. Paul began his *anthem* (v.3) by *blessing* God for *blessing* the saints with *every spiritual blessing...in Christ*.
  - a. While we are going to examine **three** *blessings* that Paul's associated with *God's Beloved...*,
  - b. I want to begin by especially focusing on the **first** of those *four*: the blessing of our *redemption*.
- 2. In Him we have **redemption** through His blood!
  - a. It's easy to see from the end of **v.6** that "in Him" refers right back to God's "Beloved," His Son Jesus Christ. Redemption is only possible in Jesus!
  - b. The **NT** vocabulary of *redemption* comes out of an entire *family* of words with meanings like: *acquittal*, *pardon*, *adoption*, *mediation*, *ransom*. Many of those words deal with *legal actions*.
  - c. The starting point here is *redemption* rooted in the idea of *paying a ransom*. *Redemption* is the language of the Roman *slave* market.
    - i. By the time the *Empire* had reached its *heights*, it included as many as **600 million** *slaves*. Slave trading was *big business*!
    - ii. Slave were to *buy*, *trade* & *use* they were simply *property*.
    - iii. But from *time to time* someone *saved up* and *bought* a slave to set him/her *free*. Paying *the full price* and then letting him *go free* with *documentation* to *prove* it was all *legitimate*.
    - iv. Paul's "redemption word" (Gr.  $\lambda \upsilon \tau \rho o \omega$ ) is rooted in the picture of buying back a slave to grant him complete freedom.

- d. You were a *slave*... The Bible clearly teaches that *every* man/woman is born into *spiritual slavery*.
  - i. In **Romans** (7), the Apostle we are all sold into bondage to sin. Paul was referring to the outcome of Adam & Eve's sin.
  - ii. Paul *also* taught (**Rom 8**) that even *creation* is *cursed* as a result of *Adam's fall*.
  - iii. Jesus said (**John 8**) "Truly, truly, I say to you, everyone who commits sin is the **slave** of sin." Our own acts of sin confirm & further entangle us in our spiritual slavery.
- c. But if you are *in Christ* you are no longer a *slave to sin* because Jesus *paid the ransom* to *secure your redemption*!
  - i. The *cost* was dear, you can't *measure* it in any *earthly currency*, you can't *weigh* it out on any *merchant's scale*...
  - ii. Your *freedom* was bought with *blood*...the *blood of Jesus*, shed on the *cross*.
  - iii. This *truth* (*blessing*) that the *Lamb of God* died to *buy your* pardon is all over your Bible: *Leviticus & Isaiah & John & Romans & Hebrews & Revelation & ...* 
    - 1. Where could you go in your Bible & *not* find the *blood of Christ*!
  - iv. **1 Pt 1:18&19** knowing that you were not **redeemed** with perishable things like silver or gold from your futile way of life inherited from your forefathers, but w/**precious blood**, as of a **lamb** unblemished & spotless, **the blood of Christ**.
    - 1. His blood bought our blessing!

- 3. Then (still v.7) Paul immediately *identifies* the result of *redemption*. The sin that *enslaved* us is now *forgiven*. It is *sent away*!
  - a. In the **OT** *sacrifice* system, on a day called *Yom Kippur*, the *priest* would receive **2** *unblemished* goats. The *first* he would *sacrifice* on the *altar*.
  - b. The *second* he would *lay* his hands on, symbolically *transferring* all the *sins of Israel* onto the animal.
  - c. The *goat* was then taken off into the *deep wilderness* and *abandoned*, *bearing the sins* of the people. It would *never return* to the camp!
  - d. In *redemption*, Jesus *died* to pay *the* penalty for *your sins*. They were *placed on Him* and taken totally *away*, never to *return* to you!
  - e. **Redemption** is the cause & **forgiveness** is its result: our trespasses are placed on Christ & paid for by Christ ... & sent away!
- 4. No human scale can measure the value of Jesus' sacrifice for His people.
  - a. Paul writes the only *scale* is the *heavenly measure* of the *grace* of *God*.
  - b. Our Father's treasury of favor, *the riches of His grace*, is poured out on us *in His Beloved*...
  - c. **V.8** ... grace is lavished (spread on thick) on you & me, His elect.

...in Him...your redemption is in Him!

## And Paul's second *stanza* has just *begun*; he follows *redemption* w/ two *more blessings* in vv.8-11 (don't read).

- 1. Let's call our *next blessing*, the privilege of "revelation." **Read vv.8b-10**.
  - a. When you gain a *privileged position*, it often allows you *access* to *information* you didn't know *before*! One of the *big blessings* that believers have in Christ is *revelation* into the mysteries of God's will.
    - i. "Revelation" is seen in Paul's interconnected use of the terms (8,9): wisdom & insight & making known & mystery & will.
    - ii. Wisdom (σο φι α) understanding of principles & teachings & truths. I think MacArthur is really helpful here when he defines wisdom as "the understanding of life's ultimate questions."
    - iii. But what do you *do* w/ your *wisdom*? In **OT** *thought*, *insight* was the *practical application* of *wisdom*. It's taking your *Bible out of the door* on Sunday & *into your life* on Monday!
    - iv. "Making known" is what God does here for us (9a)! Spec. He blesses us w/the wisdom & insight to know His will...
    - v. ...which brings us to "mystery." Mystery is a pretty common theme w/ Paul (ch.2&3); in the Bible mystery means a truth or plan that God has hidden from mankind & can't be discovered w/o His grace (help), but the mystery is revealed to whom He pleases, when He pleases.
      - 1. God does *not* give just *anyone* the ability to *decode* His *will*. So it remains a *mystery* to the world.
      - 2. But He has *revealed* His will to *us*! In fact, Paul has written in **1** Cor **2** *we have the mind of Christ*!

- b. Now Paul briefly reveals the mystery of God's will in v.10 (reread).
  - i. First of all, it isn't surprising to know that God's will is grounded "in Him"  $\rightarrow$  in Christ (9b & 10).
    - 1. Christ is the *focal point*, the *linch-pin*, of all of God's *plans*.
    - 2. Let' simply *reinforce* that by reading a little further in **ch.1: vv.18-23.** God makes Christ the *head of all*!
    - 3. Spec. (10), God will implement a *kingdom* (*administration*) in which *all things* are *gathered back up* & *given* to Christ.
    - 4. This is essentially God's plan for the *end our age* ( = *fullness of times*, v.10). You & I have been given a *preview* of history's *final chapter*!
      - a. Beloved, here is hope: history belongs to God!
      - b. God has revealed to us history ahead of time: every knee will bow & every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father! (Ph 2)
      - c. *History belongs to God*, and God will *wrap up history* into *Christ*!
- c. One more *truth* about God's *mystery*: *it's always* **good**! Paul writes (9) that God's *will* reflects God's *kind intention* **good** pleasure.

- 2. Christ has given us the *blessings* of *redemption* & *revelation* & (3<sup>rd</sup>) of an *inheritance*. (Read v.10b-11 *In Him also we have...*).
  - a. I.e, we have the *blessing* of an *inheritance* in *Christ*.
  - b. Paul *immediately* ties your *inheritance* to the *Doctrine of Election*, spec. he refers for the  $2^{nd}$  *time* to *predestination* & *God's purpose*.
    - i. Does this sound familiar? It should! Let's rewind to vv.3&4.
    - ii. God predestined you to adoption (4) & God predestined you to have a heavenly inheritance (10)! In **vv. 5&10** you simply can't miss the connections between adoption & inheritance, all made possible by predestination & election!
    - iii. Paul is simply *previewing* one of the *outcomes* of God's *choice*: God *chose* you to *adopt* you as His child & to *receive* your *inheritance* (= Phil 4. *all the riches in glory in Christ Jesus*)!
  - c. But is it *possible* that this won't *happen*? (Maybe your *circumstances* don't *feel* so *royal* this morning...) Beloved, God *assures* you that as **certainly** as you are *redeemed*, you will *receive* your *inheritance*...
    - i. It's all right here at the end of **v.11**; *I love this promise*...!
    - ii. God works all things after the counsel of His will. (2X) Just as He determined.
    - iii. Not that He works out, He simply works. I.e. He isn't reacting to the "cosmic whatever" and making a silk purse out of a sow's ear, He has predetermined it all & brings it all to pass exactly as detailed in His eternally decreed blueprint.
- 1. Before we move on, let's stop to *enjoy* the blessings of *revelation* & *inheritance*.
  - a. Both blessings are proof of your *privileged adoption*. To say it simply, only *insiders* get a *peek at the plan*! And only *sons* & *daughters* are granted an *inheritance*.

It's all yours in Christ – redemption & revelation & eternal inheritance.

### So what is God's goal in blessing you? Read v.12

- 1. "We," Paul writes, are "the first to hope in Christ." That "we" applies to all believers...
  - a. Spec., we now belong to God because of Christ, who *redeemed* us through His blood, granting *forgiveness* of our *trespasses* & release from their *penalty*.
  - b. So we are now God's because of our hope in Christ's death & resurrection. Think of "hope" here like trusting or believing.
    - i. Your *life* is to be this lovely old *hymn*: My hope is built on nothing less than Jesus' blood & righteousness!
    - ii. The apostle's "grammar of hope" (12) indicates that once upon a time you placed your hope in Jesus & you've kept on hoping in Him ever since!
    - iii. Your *hope*, beloved, from the day you *turned to Christ*, must *always & actively* remain *in Him*.
- 2. The sinner's hope in Christ brings redemption & forgiveness & revelation & inheritance, from the predestined decree to its present reality...!
- 3. And here (2<sup>nd</sup> time) is the *refrain* that *marks the end* of each of Paul's 3 *stanzas* & *reminds* us of God's *goal*: "to the praise of His glory." (vv. 6 & 12 & 14)
  - a. The *point* is that every time Paul *concludes* a category of *blessings* he wants to *remind* us of *why* we've been *blessed*. *God's goal is that...*
  - b. ...from eternity past to eternity future, from election to eternal inheritance and the eternal kingdom, God's goal is God's glory...
  - c. ...on your lips!

Redemption, Revelation, Inheritance: to the praise of the glory of His grace!
