Worldly philosophy and religion have their ethics...they are all humanistic...motivated by self interest...

I. <u>The Golden Rule is a Command—Comprehensive in its Scope—Emphatic in its Appeal</u>

A. It has Qualifications We should not do to others whatever they want...

- 1. The natural man wants his sin confirmed and helped...
- 2. The Christian has different desires... Matthew 6:33
- 3. Jesus has taught us what is righteous...

Lessons: 1. Citizens of the Kingdom are under the rule of grace...their lives are different...they can love...John 13:34-35

- 2. Our testimony is; "it is all of God..."
- 3. Here is a sure rule to live by, Galatians 6:1-2; Philippians 2:4-5

- 2. Do unto others...
