  - 1. A warning to the Christian who does not mortify bitterness of the heart it will escalate into a visible public outburst
- B. with all malice
  - 1. Practical advice on bickering and strife from J.R. Miller

# IV. What we are to put on (Eph 4:32)

- A. be kind to one another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another
  - 1. be = be becoming a work of the Spirit not from yourself
  - 2. **kind** = useful, helpful, giving
    - a. Titus 3:4-7the kindness of God
  - 3. *tender-hearted* = *compassion* and *pity* 
    - a. Matthew 18:21-27 compassion manifested in forgiveness
  - 4. *forgiving one another* (charidzomai) rooted in grace
    - a. and undeserved, unmerited forgiveness
    - b. Matthew 18:28-30 unceasing and unwearying forgiveness
    - c. Matthew 18:31 failure to forgive grieves the Spirit
    - d. Matthew 18:32-33 harsh treatment of the pitiless servant
    - e. Matthew 18:34-35 the unforgiving are not God's children
