

Jesus addresses the churches directly to give strength for today and hope for tomorrow

The scariest letter of all

### Primer on the 7 Letters

- Who they are to: Seven churches on a "postal route" circle starting at Ephesus
- A characteristic of Christ from chapter one is applied to each letter
  - o Each letter has as an opening line one of the statements about Jesus in verse 12-20.
  - Each of the seven churches presents a different aspect of Jesus' appearance, power, and authority
- All these letters deal with faithfulness to Christ in the midst of an often-threatening pagan culture
- Remember, these letters are from Jesus...
  - The words of him who was described in 1.12-20
  - Seven lampstands... wants their light to shine in the darkness
- Jesus walking among his churches; his authority is in view
- Shows knowledge of the cities as well
- All follow a similar structure and pattern
  - o Are addressed to the angel of the church; angel... or pastor?
  - Contain some marked characteristic of Jesus Christ already declared in the chapter 1 and pinpointed for that particular church's need;
  - Christ's assessment: "I know"- divine, intimate knowledge
  - Commendation or rebuke or both;
  - Contain an exhortation(s) or command(s);
  - Contain a promise connected with the balance of the book that serves to motivate obedience
  - o Call for hearing what the Spirit says to the churches.
- Ears to hear
  - Structure of Revelation.... Revelation 1 introduces the book; Revelation 2-3 are the didactic portions that teach directly; the pictures/stories that follow reinforce the teaching; point to the final triumph in Revelation 21-22
  - o Imitates Jesus teaching with parables and the word pictures/parables of Ezekiel

# Context

- Ephesus...
  - o Large city... 200,000 to 250,000 people; 24,000 seat theater
  - Wealth due to trade
- Temple to Artemis (Diana) on of the seven wonders of the ancient world

- Persecution was taking place because they would not say Jesus is Lord
  - o Intolerance grew as they became separated from Jewish umbrella
- Some suggest these seven churches represent the history of the church across the ages
  - o But: seven is a number of completeness in Revelation; seven churches represent the whole church across the ages and what we struggle with; hence, we learn from all the churches here

### Commendation

- What stands out
  - Works
  - Effort
  - Endurance
- Opposing wicked people, false apostles, and Nicolatians is tiring.
- Strong ministry practices; doctrinal purity

# Complaint

- Lost their Love
  - Devastating charge
- Backdrop
  - Connection with Ephesian elders
  - Letter to the Ephesians, 1.15
  - o 3.19 Know the love of Christ
- The first generation: known for love
  - Now second and third generation
- In general
- In particular: love for the gospel message and proclamation, cf. Matthew 24.12-14

## Command

- Remedy
  - Remember
  - Repent
  - o Works... of love for Christ... not performing for others

### Caution

- Remove the lampstand unless repent
  - Lampstand at the beginning point back to Jesus in chapter one
  - Historical allusion: The city had been moved several times because of the silting of the Cayster River.. Christ threatens to remove the church
  - Why? A church that loses its first love will eventually fall away... all the works, effort, endurance, discernment, doctrine will not matter
- We are lost without our love
- A Christian is not one going through the motions, a Christian is being who we are

# The promise, 2.7b

• What would have been open to Adam and Eve in the Garden if they had not eaten of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil is now in the New Jerusalem for believers.
