# Confession of Faith | Nicene Creed

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one being with the Father; through him all things were made. #### THE SUFFERING CHURCH

FOR MARCH: God has a habit of showing up right before things get really difficult and overwhelming, even when things seem to be at their absolute worst. We must always lean persistently and energetically into praying for our brothers and sisters who are suffering around the world in the global church. Galatians 6:9-10 reminds us not to become weary or to give up when a situation seems impossible. We may never know the many countless lives we will be connected to as God uses and responds to fervent prayer with His surprising grace.

## 1.) Ukraine

• A Baptist pastor Leonard and his wife Tatyana were arrested in a Russian-occupied part of Ukraine and have not been heard from since September. Other leaders have been forcibly seized and tortured, and churches closed.

#### 2.) Yemen

• Christians are experiencing a sharp rise in arrests and torture intended to force believers to give names and information about other Christians for interogation and persecution. Pray for emotional peace for these traumatized believers and for an end to all such harassment.

# 3.) Uganda

• Two evangelists were beaten and attacked with knives after leading several Muslims to Christ. They ask others to join them in prayer for strength to continue their ministry.

# 4.) Nigeria

• Militant groups killed more than 70 Christians in a village in central Nigeria. Over 100 more people were injured and thousands fled for their lives afterwards. Cry out to God for these hurting people. These things are happening in Nigeria to our brothers and sisters more and more.

# 5.) Mozambique

• Islamic extremists set fire to a church building and several houses, killing at least one person. A radical group also announced the killing of 20 Christians and the displacement of hundreds more. Ask the Lord to bring an end to the violence and to hide His people from further harm.

### 6.) China

- Two missionaries from a church in Beijing were arrested for evangelizing outside their immediate area, a reminder of the country's zero tolerance policy for house churches that do so. The Chinese government is serious about stamping out all forms of religious faith that are perceived to threaten the communist party and strong state rule. There is widespread state control over the distribution of Christian content and resources to discourage believers in their worship and sharing of their faith.
- Two pastors and another Christian were falsely detained on charges of fraud in October. No updates on their location or condition have been given to their families or communities.

# 7.) Sub-Saharan Africa

• Violence grows in many parts of Africa. Persecution can be pervasive and without reprieve, and often brutally violent. Pray for God's protection and for the faith and courage of our brothers and sisters.
