Notes for Further Study

- 1. Read Deuteronomy 6:1-9. Verses 4-5 (the Shema) in particular were recited morning and evening by every pious Jew.
 - a. Is there any doubt as to Who their devotion must be given? (Notice the word LORD, the Hebrew word YHWH.)
 - b. Read Philippians 3:1-11.
 - i. The recitation of the Shema was not just a ritual or a tradition but should promote a relationship.
 - ii. What (or Who) is it that Paul says He wanted to "know" which was greater than all his background, his training, and his achievements?
 - iii. Do you "know" the triune God?
- 2. Read Leviticus 19:9-18.
 - a. How was this commandment to "love your neighbor" to be demonstrated in Israel among Israelites? What are the principles behind these laws that are still valid for us?
 - b. Read Luke 10:25-37. What would have been so shocking to the lawyer who interacted with Jesus in this text?
 - c. How have you tried to justify your sinful treatment of others much like this man?
 - d. Who, according to Jesus, is our neighbor?
- 3. Consider the words of Jesus in verse 34.
 - a. Are you near, far from, or in the Kingdom of God?
 - b. Read John 3:3-5. What had to happen to Nicodemus, to the lawyer in chapter 12, or to anyone?
 - c. Read 1 Cor. 6:9-11. What had to happen for sinners to enter the Kingdom? Have you repented and believed?
