There are interwoven throughout all of Scripture certain statements that inform us that God will one day pay back those who are His enemies.

Exodus 34:7 says that God will by no means leave the guilty unpunished.

Deuteronomy 7:10 says God repays those who hate him.

Deuteronomy 32:35 says vengeance belongs to God and so does retribution.

Jeremiah 51:56 says that the LORD is a God of recompense; He will repay.

Romans 12:19 says, "Vengeance is Mine, I will repay, says the Lord."

All of these statements teach us something very important about God. No matter how powerful or prosperous or prominent those who are His enemies are, there will come a future day when God will destroy them with full vengeance.

Both the O.T. and the N.T. present this truth about God. In fact, God wants His own people to realize there will come a day when I will fully pay back your enemies. This is part of His character. That is exactly what this Psalm is all about. God will one day take revenge on people who were His enemies and on people who were the enemies of His people.

The primary point of this Psalm is this:

# GOD'S PEOPLE CAN TAKE GREAT COMFORT IN THE FACT THAT THERE WILL COME A TIME WHEN GOD WILL PAY BACK WITH FULL <u>VENGEANCE</u> THOSE WHO DID ARROGANT AND HURTFUL THINGS AGAINST HIS PEOPLE.

This Psalm has specific relevance to Israel. It is a Psalm that features both a <u>national</u> lament (Psalm 94:1-15) and a <u>personal</u> lament (Psalm 94:16-23). But it also has application to us all. There are times when we cry out to God for help and for deliverance and sometimes it does not appear as though God is answering.

We must not ever assume God is not watching and listening. The fact is He does watch and He does listen and there will come a time when He will settle the score against those who did things against Him and His people. That is what Psalm 94 is all about.

Now there are four main parts to this Psalm:

PART #1 – God's people have every right to pray to God concerning <u>vengeance</u>. 94:1-3

God's people have every right to talk to God about this subject. There is nothing wrong with wanting God to be a God of vengeance because He is that by definition. The one talking to God here is very open and honest. There are a series of five true assumptions about God that are made here:

# <u>True Assumption #1</u> - God is a God of <u>vengeance</u>. **94:1a**

It has often been said that there is a difference between revenge and vengeance. Revenge is an act of passion, whereas vengeance is an act of justice. I am not certain about this, but what is revealed here is that vengeance is consistent with the perfect character of God.

True Assumption #2 - God is a God who is able to shine forth His vengeance. 94:1b

Since God is a God of vengeance, there is nothing wrong with wanting God to shine this part of His character forth against enemies. God can shine forth vengeance just as easily as He can blessings.

# <u>True Assumption #3</u> - God is the <u>judge</u> of the earth. **94:2a**

Now most people do not want to think about God in these terms. But the fact is He is the judge of everything and one day He will judge everything and everyone. Now to us some people who have done us wrong are out of our reach; but not to God. He will judge the entire earth.

# <u>True Assumption #4</u> - God is a God who pays back the <u>proud</u>. **94:2b**

One theme that dominates the entire Bible is that God hates pride and God hates the proud. Now the fact is proud people will not be stopped or silenced by any human. In fact, proud people must be stopped and silenced by God and He promises that one day He will do just that.

#### <u>True Assumption #5</u> - God is a God who controls the <u>time</u> of the wicked. 94:3

This is a very important theological point for us to grasp. Wicked people are time controlled by God. God operates according to His time which often for us seems like a long time. When you are the one suffering the hurt, you want God to move fast and you want God to move now. The Psalmist knew that the time of this was in the sovereign hands of God.

PART #2 – God's people are legitimate in giving an accurate <u>description</u> of the wicked. 94:4-7

There are six character traits brought out about wicked people. These character traits are also offenses against God and the people of God. These people deserve God's vengeance and the writer spells out why:

#### <u>Character Trait #1</u> - The wicked speak <u>arrogantly</u>. **94:4a**

Wicked people speak arrogantly against God and against those who are right with God. Wicked people know how to use words. They know how to reason, boast, threaten, mock and insult. When we speak arrogantly, we are speaking wickedly.

#### <u>Character Trait #2</u> - The wicked <u>vaunt</u> themselves. **94:4b**

Wicked people love to vaunt themselves. As one Bible teacher said, wicked people love to "glorify themselves." They love to promote themselves and present themselves as winners who should be highly elevated by all.

## <u>Character Trait #3</u> - The wicked <u>crush</u> God's faithful people. **94:5a**

Their goal is to break and crush faithful people of God. They will not honor faithful people of God; they want to destroy them.

## <u>Character Trait #4</u> - The wicked <u>afflict</u> God's faithful people. **94:5b**

Wicked people do negative things against those who are faithful to pressure them and to hurt them.

# <u>Character Trait #5</u> - The wicked hurt <u>helpless</u> people. **94:6**

Widows, orphans and strangers were weak and needed help and support. Wicked people do great harm to helpless people.

#### Character Trait #6 - The wicked mock God. 94:7

Wicked people speak against God. Their view is God does not see us and God will not stop us. These people live their lives flaunting and boasting about the fact that God will not ever do anything to oppose them or stop them.

#### PART #3 – God's Word warns those who are senseless and stupid. 94:8-11

In the context of this Psalm, the senseless and stupid people are those who think they are just getting away with their wickedness and think God does not see it and won't do anything about it. There are nine warnings God gives to these people:

## Warning #1 - Senseless and stupid people need to <u>listen</u> to and <u>heed</u> God's Word. 94:8a

Senseless and stupid people need to put aside their proud arrogance and start listening to and obeying the Word of God. The assumption here is that they go to a place where they can hear it.

#### Warning #2 - Senseless and stupid people need to understand God's Word. 94:8b

The key to changing status from being senseless and stupid to spiritual and wise is a desire to understand God's Word.

Warning #3 - Senseless and stupid people need to know God hears everything. 94:9a

Every idle word and every conversation has been heard by God. Context is this is the God of vengeance.

Warning #4 - Senseless and stupid people need to know God sees everything. 94:9b

God sees everything. He sees it all and He knows it all so what in the world do we have to be proud about?

**Verse 9** clearly informs us that God is responsible for giving people their ears and eyes and He knows exactly what they have done with their ears and eyes. He knows what they have listened to; He knows what they have seen.

Warning #5 - Senseless and stupid people need to know God will <u>punish</u> nations. 94:10a

One commentator observed if God will discipline the nations, He will also discipline the individuals who make up the nation, because nations are comprised of individuals.

Warning #6 - Senseless and stupid people need to know God will rebuke nations. 94:10b

There will come a day of accountability in which all nations will stand before God and one key specific element of assessment will be their treatment of Israel. God will judge nations in the way they treated Israel.

Warning #7 - Senseless and stupid people need to know God gives people knowledge . 94:10c

God is the One who must give a person knowledge. If a person is to change classifications from one foolish to one wise, God must grant that.

Warning #8 - Senseless and stupid people need to know God knows a person's <u>thoughts</u>.

94:11a

Think of the millions and millions of thoughts you have had and think about this—God has known every one of them. He knows the thoughts of those who love Him and those who don't. He knows the thoughts of the humble and the proud. He knows the thoughts of those who are godly and those who are godless.

Warning #9 - Senseless and stupid people need to know their life is a mere breath . 94:11b

The fact is wicked people are literally one breath away from eternity and God can pull one into eternity with rapid speed. Men are nothing compared to God. They are a vapor.

PART #4 – God's people need to know true realizations about God. 94:12-23

There are thirteen important and even comforting realizations in these verses that are designed to encourage God's people when experiencing negative things from wicked people:

Realization #1 - God chastens those who are blessed by Him. 94:12a

If God has let you go through some chastening experience and you have come to loathe your pride and sin, you have learned what God wants and you have been blessed by Him.

<u>Realization #2</u> - God <u>instructs</u> from His Word those blessed by Him. **94:12b** 

People right with God love the Word of God because they are given instruction. When being chastened, go to the Word for instruction.

<u>Realization #3</u> - God does grant His people <u>relief</u> when in adversity. **94:13** 

God may not immediately remove wicked people for a while, but He will grant relief to His people. In Israel's history, God removed dominate powers from destroying His nation.

Realization #4 - God will not abandon or forsake His people when they are in adversity. 94:14

God's people need to always remember this fact—God will not ever abandon His people.

**Realization #5** - God will eventually <u>judge</u> in righteousness and encourage the upright. **94:15** 

God's upright people follow righteous judgments. They may not like them, but the upright learn from them.

**Realization** #6 - God will take a stand for Himself against the wicked. 94:16

Sometimes we need someone to stand for us against the wicked. Now we are to stand for God; but sometimes that is a lonely stand. We need help and the one who can help us is God.

**Realization #7** - God has helped us or we would have been <u>destroyed</u>. **94:17** 

Do not miss the theology of this. God is a God of vengeance. He knows all of our thoughts. If God does not help us, our soul will be destroyed. We will have destroyed it ourselves.

Realization #8 - God by His mercy held us up or we would have slipped away. 94:18

Our tottering feet have walked way off the path of God multiple times and if it were not for God's mercy, we would have slipped away.

Realization #9 - God comforts us with His Word in times of great anxiety. 94:19

Do you see what is stated here? When we are going through anxious things, God may not immediately remove the wicked enemy; but He will immediately remove the anxiety. God is able to comfort you when you sin. He is able to comfort you when you are sick.

He is able to comfort you when you are discouraged and when you are under attack. His comfort comes to you through what He reveals in His precious Word.

Realization #10 - God does not ever ally Himself with those who do evil. 94:20

God is **NEVER** on the side of those who do evil.

<u>Realization #11</u> - God's people need to know that wicked people <u>unite</u> together to <u>destroy</u> righteous people. **94:21** 

Charles Spurgeon said these people are great at slander and false allegations. They will use any means possible to trample down a righteous child of God and servant of the Lord.

<u>Realization #12</u> - God's people need to know <u>God</u> gives strength and protection to His people. **94:22** 

Sometimes it takes enemies in our world to teach us this great lesson. We are not strong in ourselves and we cannot even protect ourselves; God must do it and God's Word informs us time and time again that He is the God who does this.

**<u>Realization #13</u>** - God's people need to know that God will <u>destroy</u> evil people. **94:23** 

What God's people may always know is that God is a God of vengeance. It may not be immediate; but it is definite.
