

The Story of the Passion Week

Sunday: Palm Sunday (*Matthew 21:1–11, Mark 11:1–11, Luke 19:28–44, John 12:9–19*)

- ☐ Context: Jesus raised Lazarus from the dead and the word had spread!
- ☐ Jesus enters Jerusalem riding on a donkey's colt.
- ☐ This is a fulfillment of Scripture.
- ☐ The crowds welcome Him with the 'red carpet treatment' and with shouts calling Him the 'Son of David' and 'the King who comes in the name of the Lord' (Luke 19:38) and the 'King of Israel.'
- ☐ The religious leaders grow in concern and opposition.
- ☐ Jesus weeps over Jerusalem and foretells its destruction.
- ☐ Jesus comes into the temple and looks around and then leaves for Bethany.

Monday: Cleansing of the Temple (*Matthew 21:12–22, Mark 11:12–19, Luke 19:45–48*)

- ☐ Jesus curses the fig tree.
- ☐ Jesus cleanses the temple and teaches in the temple.
- ☐ Jesus heals the sick and is praised by the children.
- ☐ The religious leaders grow in concern and opposition.

Tuesday: Conflict with Religious Leaders (*Matthew 21:23–26:5, Mark 11:27–14:2, Luke 20:1–22:2, John 12:37–50*)

- ☐ Jesus explains the cursing of the fig tree.
- ☐ Question about Jesus' Authority
- ☐ Parable of the Two Sons
- ☐ Parable of the Landowner
- ☐ Question about the Chief Cornerstone
- ☐ Parable of the Marriage Feast
- ☐ Question about Paying Taxes to Caesar
- ☐ Question about Marriage in the Resurrection
- ☐ Question about the Greatest Commandment
- ☐ Question about David's 'Lord'
- ☐ Condemnation of the Scribes and Pharisees
- ☐ Teaching on the Widow's Offering
- ☐ Foretelling of the Destruction of Jerusalem
- ☐ Teaching on the Destruction of the Temple and the Return of Christ
- ☐ Parable of the Fig Tree
- ☐ Parable of the Two Slaves
- ☐ Parable of the Ten Virgins
- ☐ Parable of the Talents
- ☐ Parable of the Sheep and Goats
- ☐ Jesus foretells His death.
- ☐ Jesus proclaims His faithfulness to speak God's Word.

Wednesday: Anointing and Betrayal (*Matthew 26:6–16, Mark 14:3–11, Luke 22:3–6; 21:37–38; John 12:1–8*)

- ☐ Jesus teaches in the temple.
- ☐ Religious leaders are plotting to kill Jesus.
- ☐ Jesus is eating at the home of Simon the Leper in Bethany.
- ☐ A woman (namely, Mary the sister of Martha and Lazarus) anoints His head with costly perfume and the disciples' (especially Judas) oppose this action.
- ☐ This was a preparation for Jesus' burial that would be memorialized.
- ☐ Judas goes to the chief priests to betray Jesus to them.

Thursday: The Last Supper (*Matthew 26:17–75, Mark 14:12–72, Luke 22:7–71, John 13:1–18:27*)

- ☐ The disciples prepare a room to celebrate the Passover.
- ☐ Jesus celebrates the Passover with His twelve disciples.
- ☐ Jesus washes their feet.
- ☐ Jesus tells them that one of them (namely Judas) will betray Him.
- ☐ Jesus tells Peter that he will deny Him.
- ☐ Jesus teaches them about abiding in the Vine.
- ☐ Jesus teaches them about the Holy Spirit.
- ☐ Jesus goes to the Garden of Gethsemane and prays.
- ☐ Jesus is arrested.

Friday: The Crucifixion (*Matthew 27:1–61, Mark 15:1–47, Luke 23:1–56, John 18:28–19:42*)

- ☐ Celebration of the Passover.
- ☐ Jesus appears before the Sanhedrin.
- ☐ Jesus is beaten and mocked.
- ☐ Jesus appears before Pilot.
- ☐ Jesus appears before Herod.
- ☐ Jesus is scourged.
- ☐ Jesus is crucified. (9:00 AM: when the High Priest presented the Sacrificial Lamb)
- ☐ Jesus died. (3:00 PM: when the Sacrificial Lamb was slaughtered)
- ☐ Joseph of Arimathea buries Jesus' body in his own tomb just before sundown on Friday evening.

Saturday: Buried (*Matthew 27:62–66*)

- ☐ Feast of Unleavened Bread.
- ☐ The religious leaders ask Pilot for security at Jesus' tomb.

Sunday: Resurrection Day (*Matthew 28:1–20, Mark 16:1–8, Luke 24:1–53, John 20:1–21:25*)

- ☐ Feast of First Fruits.
- ☐ Jesus rises from the dead.
- ☐ Jesus appears to Mary Magdalene and to Peter.
- ☐ Jesus appears to the two on the road to Emmaus and to ten of the eleven disciples.
