he makes me tread on my high places.


Hymn of Parting Great Is Thy Faithfulness

Message: *What on Earth is Happening? The Back Story*

Text: Zephaniah 1.1-2.3

What did Habakkuk know... and when did he know it?

- Habakkuk 1.5
 - Gary Elliott
- God's always doing a global work
 - Myopic
 - Myopia
 - Focused on our own world
- He had the book of Zephaniah

Zephaniah: God's answer: a Day of the Lord

- The Day of the Lord, 1.2-4, cf. 2.7, 2.14
 - Refers to the "Day" 17 times in 1.2-2.3
 - Starts out global- For the nations
 - For Israel... for Judah... even more narrowly, for Jerusalem
 - Later, we will see him expand his concern back out
- Is This a Day of the Lord for us... and the world?
 - I don't have the authority to pronounce that
 - We can look at scripture
 - God is the God of the storm
 - This is his storm
 - To not believe that is to put chaos in charge
- Fear- a story line that leads to faith
 - That's what we want to follow...
 - How to get there
- So is this a day of the Lord? Perhaps it is...
 - But to borrow from Tony Evans-A divine disruption
 - Would God have a reason to bring our world to its knees- to humble as he has?

What did Zephaniah observe...

- Sin, 1.4-8
- Silence, 2.7
- Sin, 2.8-2.13

The Day of the Lord reviewed, 1.14-18

- Obviously pointing to the ultimate day of the Lord

Zephaniah's solution, 2.1-3

- A world in rebellion
- A church that has lost its course
- But what about my own sin....
- Be silent
- Seek the Lord
 - Cf. 1.6
 - Whatever else we are seeking
- Seek righteousness
 - Holiness rooted in grace
- Seek humility
 - A world caught up in me

Judgment

- The righteous get caught up with the wicked- we see that in Revelation

On Zephaniah's road to hope

- Our ultimate security is in how God regards us
- The faith that Zephaniah is moving to in chapter 3.14-17

So What About Us?

- We should not be surprised about a diving disruption
- Be silent/fix thoughts on God
- Self-examine/Repent
 - A lot of finger pointing...
