The Futility of Knowledge Ecclesiastes 1:12-18

Main Point:

Knowledge is important but not ultimate because what you're looking for can only be found in God.

- 1. Like Solomon, many look for answers through the accumulation of the world's knowledge.
- 2. But this is both a burdensome and futile task.

- 3. Because the world's knowledge doesn't have all the answers you're looking for.
- 4. Because accumulating the world's knowledge always leads to further sorrow.
- 5. Instead, you need to accumulate the kind of knowledge that matters most.

Philip Ryken "[Solomon] wanted to know as much as he could about as many things as he could ... In short, he wanted to know everything about everything under the sun."

Romans 8:20 20 For the creation was subjected to futility, not willingly, but because of $\lim_{n \to \infty} W_n$ who subjected $it \dots (NKJV)$
