Sermon: Our Lord and Savior's Death Scripture: Isaiah 53:10-11

Introduction: Luke 24:25-27

- I. It was the will of God (vs. 10a; John 3:16; I John 4:10; Acts 2:23).
- II. For Christ to suffer and be our substitutionary sacrifice (vs. 10b,c; Isaiah 53:4a,5,6,12b; Romans 8:3; II Cor. 5:21; Eph. 5:2; Gal. 2:20).
- III. His suffering death sacrifice would be successful.
  - A. Effectual for His people (vs. 10d; John 1:12-13; I John 3:1a; Hebrews 2:10-11; Ps. 100:3; John 20:17; Romans 8:17).
  - B. Eternal Lord (vs. 10e; Eph. 1:20-23).
  - C. Glorifying God (vs. 10f)
- IV. As a result of His suffering, He would be satisfied (vs. 11a,b; Matt. 27:46; John 10:15-17; Hebrews 12:2; Luke 22:15; John 12:27-28).
- V. Christ the Righteous One, God's servant, would justify His people, bearing their sins (vs. 11c,d,e; Romans 5:18-19; II Cor. 5:21; John 10:14,15,29; Matt. 1:21).
