

THE FIRST & SECOND LETTERS OF PETER THE GOSPEL ACCORDING TO MARK

FIVE INTRODUCTORY DETAILS ABOUT THIS LETTER FROM ITS CONCLUSION (1 PETER 5:12–14)

- 1. Peter dictated this letter to Silas (verse 12).
- 2. Peter's first letter explains "the true grace of God" (verse 12).
- 3. Peter wrote this letter around AD 64 from "Babylon"—probably Rome (verse 13).
- 4. As Peter wrote, he was with Mark, his dearly loved "son in the faith" (verse 13).
- 5. Peter loved Christians as his own family (verse 14).
