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His work of Creation is the first part of God working out of His decree by creating time, space, and matter.

It is the first means by which God brings His eternal plan to realization in time and space. Creation is mentioned in every part (section) of Scripture. According to Hebrews 11.3, it is an article of our faith. The Apostles' Creed summarizes it for us: "I believe in God the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth." – James Renihan, Baptist Symbolics II, P. 127

This paragraph in the 2LBC is almost identical in the Savoy and Westminster, but is separated into a 3rd paragraph. The Framers of the 2LBC probably wanted to make a greater distinction between Moral Law (the law written on the heart of Adam which required no special revelation) and Positive Law (which requires special revelation).

3. Positive Law

A. An External Commandment

Paragraph 3. Besides the Law written in their hearts, they received (i) a command not to eat of the tree of knowledge of good and evil;

i Genesis 6:17 – "And behold, I, even I am bringing the flood of water upon the earth, to destroy all flesh in which is the breath of life, from under heaven; everything that is on the earth shall perish."

Genesis 3:8-10 – And they heard the sound of the Lord God walking in the garden in the cool of the day, and the man and his wife hid themselves from the presence of the Lord God among the trees of the garden. Then the Lord God called to the man, and said to him, "Where are you?" And he said, "I heard the sound of Thee in the garden, and I was afraid because I was naked; so I hid myself."
