- It provides His soul was being crushed (breaketh) awaiting justice for those that were persecuting. This of justice was objectionable to those that pursued him. His cries for relief were met by scorn, and his dedication to God was his enemies' motivation to pursue him.
- It provides He examines the state of the wicked from the perspective of God's truth and finds that their end will be than his. They are rebuked (reproved) and cursed (loathed).

The final imperative is the (rolling away, ie. Gilgal) of his reproach (shame) and contempt (despisal). Even when powerful (Princes - sar) were set against him, he remained faithful to the testimonies of God. The Word of God was his great source of!

Yet, like the Psalmist of old, we must abide in the truths of the Word of God. Only by keeping this truth will reward, revelation, and relief occur!
