Deadly Dullnes Part 2

Someone Better
Hebrews 6:1-12
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Important definitions:

- Dullness = GK *nothros* <u>lazy</u>, sluggish, languid or <u>apathetic</u>.
- Perfect (perfection) = GK teleiotēs <u>completeness</u>, full development, <u>full belief</u>, wholeness, entirely outfitted – <u>mature</u>.
- 1. Spiritual **immaturity** is a result of dullness toward God's word. 5:12-6:3 What is that like?
 - a. Unable to **communicate** the word to others *ought to be teachers*... (Verse 12)
 - b. Unable to get beyond the **ABC's** of the faith (verse 12b)— need to be taught again the *first principles* of the *oracles* of God.
 - c. Unable to **digest** spiritual meat. (12c-14)
 - d. Unable to <u>discern</u> between good and evil (14) here is perhaps the biggest danger.
 - e. Unable to get past symbols and shadows to the <u>reality of a relationship</u> with Jesus. 6:1-3
- 2. Spiritual **Indecision** is a deadly result of dullness toward God's word. 6:4-8.
 - a. 5 powerful reasons to believe. (Note the pronouns)
 - i. They had been enlightened.
 - ii. They had **tasted** the heavenly gift. Jn 6:51.
 - *iii.* They had **partaken** of the Holy Spirit. Jn 16:8.
 - *iv.* They had **tasted** the good word of God.
 - v. They **witnessed** the power of the world to come.
 - **b.** One sad response to God's last word <u>rejection!</u>
 - c. One horrendous result of the wrong response finding that <u>repentance</u> is <u>impossible.</u>
 - d. We are responsible for what we hear if we reject God's message; God will reject us (Verses 7-8)

Two sobering summary thoughts:

Dullness or laziness toward God's word leads a Christian to **fruitlessness and confusion**.

Dullness leads a yet unsaved and hesitant person to **Hell**.
