- Proverbs 1-9 choose wisdom and folly
- Change in style: antithetical parallelism
 - "a wise son makes glad a father
 - "but a foolish so, is a grief to his mother"

I. Two Children: Wisdom and Fool (10: 1-7)

• Antithetical parallelism: characters introduced: v. 1a

A. Child #1: A wise child brings joy to his father 10: b

- Christ the second Adam the wise Son
 - *a)* A joy to his father and those who have authority over him (1.a)
 - *b) Deliverance and sustenance for the wise son (2b, 3a)*
 - c) Blessing of the righteous, in their diligence they are prosperous (4b,5a)
 - d) Favor of the Lord rests upon him, he is remembered forever (6a, 7a)

B. Child #2: A foolish child brings grief to his mother (10:c)

- Adam the first born dead in sins and trespasses
 - a) The shame, dishonor & grief of a rebellious child (1:c)
 - b) Living for this world, living for dust, ashes, and death (2a, 3b)
 - c) Laziness and idleness (4a, 5b)
 - d) Mouth of the wicked covered with violence, their name, a curse (6b,7b)
