## Grant Van Leuven PECA Sermon Outline on Romans 6:14, WLC Q&A 75, Feb. 26, 2012

## Intro:

Sanctification. READ WLC Q&A 75

EP (Main point of text): Christians do not live in bondage to sin because their relation to God's Law is no longer a Covenant of Works but a Covenant of Grace.

HP (Main application of text): Don't live like slaves.

## Move 1: God sanctified and sanctifies you.

LC: "Sanctification is <u>a work of God's grace</u>, whereby they whom God hath, before the foundation of the world, <u>chosen to be holy</u>, are in time, through the powerful operation of his Spirit":

- According as <u>he hath chosen</u> us in him before the foundation of the world, <u>that we should be holy and without blame before him in love</u>: (Eph 1:4). Justification dealt w/ guilt, sanctification, corruption.
- And such were some of you: but <u>ye are washed, but ye are sanctified</u>, but ye are justified in the name of the Lord Jesus, and <u>by the Spirit of our God</u>. (1Co 6:11). You didn't wash.
- ... <u>God hath from the beginning chosen you to salvation through sanctification of the Spirit</u> ... (2Th 2:13)

LC: "applying the death and resurrection of Christ unto them": READ Romans 6:4-6. New life.

## Move 2: God made you a saint able to approach Him in worship now.

Explain: LC: "renewed in their whole man after the image of God":

- And be renewed in the spirit of your mind; (Eph 4:23) Imperative. Why? Indicative.
- And that ye put on the new man, which after God is created in righteousness and true holiness. (Eph 4:24). Can be told to be holy because the Spirit made you holy.
- "Definitive sanctification." Why Paul addresses Corinthians as "them that are sanctified." Eph 1:1, Phil 1, Col 1:2: "saints". Commanded to be holy, because Christ made holy.

Move 3: God wants you to live more and more like the person He has made you to be.

LC: "having the seeds of repentance unto life, and all other saving graces, put into their hearts":

- When they heard these things, they ... glorified God, saying, Then <u>hath God also to the</u> <u>Gentiles granted repentance unto life</u>. (Act 11:18) Effect of Spirit's work is turning away from sin. Don't want to be dirty any more in deeds of death, for have been given lovely life.
- Whosoever is <u>born of God doth not commit sin</u>; <u>for his seed remaineth in him</u>: and he cannot sin, because he is born of God. (1Jo 3:9) New nature hates sin. Old body sins (vs. 12/Rm. 7).

LC: "those graces so stirred up, increased and strengthened, as that they more and more die unto sin, and rise unto newness of life": Sanctification a "work". Irreversible, but ongoing. "Progressive sanctification":

- Ongoing process of growing in holiness that began inside you at regeneration: new birth that keeps growing into mature holy expression through you: 1) Mortify sin; 2) growth in grace.
- Living people are meant to walk and grow. Exercise yourself unto godliness: 1 Timothy 4:7.
- But ye, beloved, building up yourselves on your most holy faith, praying in the Holy Ghost, (Jud 1:20)
- And we desire that <u>every one of you do shew the same diligence</u> to the full assurance of hope unto the end: That ye <u>be not slothful</u>, but followers of them who through faith and patience inherit the promises. (Heb 6:11-12).
- READ Ephesians 3:16-19.
- ... <u>walk worthy of the Lord</u> unto all pleasing, <u>being fruitful in every good work</u>, and increasing in the knowledge of God; Strengthened with all might ... (Col 1:10-11)
- Romans 6:14. Answers question of vss. 1-2. Only new nature by grace can live holy.
  - o Not under the law does not mean freedom to sin, but freedom from sinning against the Law, which only new nature by grace can enjoy. Against Antinomianism.
  - o Rom. 13:10: love is the fulfillment of the law. Obedience not legalism, but love.
  - o Not Satan. "dominion": lord over/rule. Grace frees from slavery to sin. Frees from condemnation so you don't say, "why bother". Instead, show: "I love you, Brother".

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HP: Don't live like slaves.
