•	Wrong interpretations of the Bible are often the result of our ownor
•	We can only expect to understand the correct meaning of a text when we work to get the correct meaning the text, and not when we impose our thoughts and ideas onto the text.
2.	Beware of falling into common when interpreting the Scriptures.
A	. We must avoid the text.
•	EXAMPLE 1: The Bible says in John 1.1, "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God.", but if you read it as saying, "the Word was one of the gods", then you have misread the text.
•	EXAMPLE 2: Jesus says in John 14.6, "I am the Way", but if you read it as saying "I am one of the Ways", then you have misread the text.

• EXAMPLE 4: David says in Psalm 37.4, "Delight yourself in the Lord, and he will give you the desires of your heart.", but if you read it as only saying, "He will give you the desires of your heart", then you have misread the text.

• EXAMPLE 3: Paul says in 1 Tim 6.10, "For the love of money is a root of all kinds of evils.", but if you read it as saying, "Money is the root of all evil," you have

misread the text.
