

Devotional for Each Day of the Week

Sunday: “Do not slay them, lest my people forget; scatter them by Your power, and bring them down, O Lord our shield.”—Psalm 59:11. **Praise God** for knowing exactly how to deal with your enemies. **Pray** for the strength not to vindicate yourself, but to allow God to exercise justice. **Pray** for the Birmingham (Ala.) Reformed Presbyterian Fellowship, as it gathers for the first time for worship this afternoon and next Lord’s Day afternoon.

Monday: “When He comes, in that Day, to be glorified in His saints and to be admired among all those who believe, because our testimony among you was believed.”—II Thessalonians 1:10. **Pray** that God would glorify Himself in your life today. **Pray** for the Orlando (Fla.) Reformed Presbyterian Church.

Tuesday: “Therefore we also pray always for you that our God would count you worthy of this calling, and fulfill all the good pleasure of His goodness and the work of faith with power.”—II Thessalonians 1:11. **Pray** that the Lord would lead you in working out anything that gets in the way of your calling in Him. **Pray** for our nation’s leaders that they would do what is right in the sight of God, and repent of any sins.

Wednesday: “. . . that the name of our Lord Jesus Christ may be glorified in you, and you in Him, according to the grace of our God and the Lord Jesus Christ.”—II Thessalonians 1:12. **Pray** that God would help you see the grace of Jesus Christ in your life. **Pray** for the Reformed Presbyterian Church ministry in Bangalore, India.

Thursday: “Now, brethren, concerning the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ and our gathering together to Him, we ask you not to be soon shaken in mind or troubled, either by spirit or by word or by letter, as if from us, as though the day of Christ had come.”—II Thessalonians 2:1-2. **Pray** that God would help you recognize that your salvation is His job. **Pray** for your family and friends who need to believe in Jesus. **Pray** for church planting efforts by the Reformed Presbyterian Church of Australia in the city of Melbourne.

Friday: “Let no one deceive you by any means; for that Day will not come unless the falling away comes first, and the man of sin is revealed, the son of perdition.”—II Thessalonians 2:3. **Pray** that God would increase your understanding of His written truth. **Pray** for Milwaukee (Wisc.) Reformed Christian Ministries, as it begins worship services this month.

Saturday: “. . . who opposes and exalts himself above all that is called God or that is worshiped, so that he sits as God in the temple of God, showing himself that he is God.”—II Thessalonians 2:4. **Pray** for the overthrow of Antichrist. **Pray** that God will help you submit every aspect of your life to Him, without reservation, so that you don’t attempt to play god of your own life. **Pray** also that God would bring many people to church tomorrow, and would bring those who are lost to salvation.

“If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins, and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness.”—I John 1:9.

Q. 32. What benefits do they that are effectually called partake of in this life?

A. They that are effectually called do in this life partake of justification, adoption, and sanctification, and the several benefits which in this life do either accompany or flow from them.

B. love our neighbor as ourselves (Leviticus 19:18); the Golden Rule
