I. The Context, Significance and Meaning of our Passage

- A. The Sermon on the Mount reveals our short-comings...
- B. We sense with grief our need for grace...
- C. There is grace sufficient...
- D. Our response to Jesus' sermon ought to be: ask, seek, knock... i.e pray sincerely, urgently, persistently...
- 1. Ask, a general term meaning to make your request known...
- 2. Seek, implies we may not know what we're looking for our how to ask... Romans 8:26
- 3. Knock, implies that sometimes things seem closed off and blocked up...
- E. The Good news—there is the promise of help... Hebrews 4:16; James 5:16

II. The Nature of True Prayer

- A. There is sincere desire Isaiah 26:8-9; Psalm 38:9-10; Romans 8:26
- B. There is a sense of urgency
- 1. So few prayer warriors... Isaiah 64:7
- 2. Prayer was an urgent and primary activity of the Apostles... I Thessalonians 1:2ff; II Thessalonians 1:11ff; Romans 1:9-10; Colossians 1:3, 9
- 3. An expectation of all Christians... Romans 12:12

Observation: Ask, seek, and knock together sum up what it is to pray... see Isaiah 55:6, 7; Proverbs 2:3-5; Matthew 7:7-8 cf. vs. 11

C. There must be persistence...

- 1. A continuous activity... Genesis 32:24-26; Isaiah 62:7; Ephesians 6:18; I Thessalonians 5:17
- 2. This is underscored by our Lord's teaching... Luke 11:5-13
- 3. Scripture gives numerous examples...
- a. The Syro-Phoenician woman in Matthew 15:21-28
- b. Blind Bartimaeus in Mark 10:46-52

Lessons: 1. Prayer is an activity of faith...

2. Our faith is strengthened and informed by God's word... see John 15:1ff

Observations: 1. The necessity of praying this way to our Christian walk...

- 2. God tests our faith in order to increase and strengthen it...
- 3. God is not reluctant to answer our prayers...
