### Catalyst Group Discussion Questions – Mark 11:1–11 Week of March 4, 2012

This series begins a six-week journey through the last week of Jesus life as recorded in the gospel of Mark. Each week we will look at a particular day as we work our way towards the crucifixion and resurrection of Jesus. The first day begins with Jesus' "Triumphal Entry" into the city of Jerusalem. Mark's goal in describing this event is to show how Jesus has come as the promised King and Savior for all who will trust in Him.

#### Discussion

• What was the best "entrance" to an event or party you've ever seen? What did that entrance tell you about that person?

#### Examination

- What does Jesus command to go and a specific colt (11:1-3) say about Jesus?
- What is the significance of the crowds laying down their cloaks and leafy branches down before Jesus?
- Where does the statement of the crowds in 11:9-10 come from in the Old Testament? Why is this important?
- What does Jesus' entry into Jerusalem say about who He is?

#### Application

- How does Jesus' authority reveal itself in your life?
- How does lesus' sovereignty over all things help you in your life?
- What does the humility of Christ teach us about his nature?
- How are you responding and to Christ the King in your life?
