THE WORD AND THE SACRAMENT

Reading of God's Word Ii Kings 7.1-11 Pew Bible, p. 939

But Elisha said, "Hear the word of the Lord: thus says the Lord, Tomorrow about this time a seah of fine flour shall be sold for a shekel, and two seahs of barley for a shekel, at the gate of Samaria." ² Then the captain on whose hand the king leaned said to the man of God, "If the Lord himself should make windows in heaven, could this thing be?" But he said, "You shall see it with your own eyes, but you shall not eat of it." ³ Now there were four men who were lepers at the entrance to the gate. And they said to one another, "Why are we sitting here until we die? ⁴ If we say, 'Let us enter the city,' the famine is in the city, and we shall die there. And if we sit here, we die also. So now come, let us go over to the camp of the Syrians. If

they spare our lives we shall live, and if they kill us we shall but die." ⁵ So they arose at twilight to go to the camp of the Syrians. But when they came to the edge of the camp of the Syrians, behold, there was no one there. ⁶ For the Lord had made the army of the Syrians hear the sound of chariots and of horses, the sound of a great army, so that they said to one another, "Behold, the king of Israel has hired against us the kings of the Hittites and the kings of Egypt to come against us." ⁷ So they fled away in the twilight and abandoned their tents, their horses, and their donkeys, leaving the camp as it was, and fled for their lives. ⁸ And when these lepers came to the edge of the camp, they went into a tent and ate and drank, and they carried off silver and gold and clothing and went and hid them. Then they came back and entered another tent and carried off things from it and went and hid them. ⁹ Then they said to one another, "We are not doing right. This day is a day of good news. If we are silent and wait until the morning light, punishment will overtake us. Now therefore come; let us go and tell the king's household." O So they came and called to the gatekeepers of the city and told them, "We came to the camp of the Syrians, and behold, there was no one to be seen or heard there, nothing but the horses tied and the donkeys tied and the tents as they were." 11 Then the gatekeepers called out, and it was told within the king's household.



Short Kingdom Parable by Jesus: pearl of great price

Matthew 13.45-46

DEFINITIONS:

Vision: Seeing things as they should be in contrast to the way they are.

Mission: Make the vision a reality... (cf. Jesus, Luke 19.10)

Passion: the desire to bring the vision about.

Principle: Passion grows when it is driven by and/or embraces the value – or the worth- of the mission and

vision

Vision: Seeing things how God intends them to be instead of the way things are

Our vision: for the glory of Christ to fill the earth so that the whole world may know the true God (in

contrast to them not knowing that now).

Our mission is to take the good news of the gospel to the world; The Great Commission **Our passion** is our desire to carry out the mission so that the vision is accomplished.

The Situation, II Kings 6.24-31

- How desperate the world really is.
 - o Ben-hadad's power
 - ∘ Bad economy
 - Starvation
 - Cannibalism
- Do we grasp?
 - Paralyzed leadership: Sackcloth but hidden
 - Blames Elisha!

The Confrontation, 6.32-33-7.2

- Elders meet with Elijah
- Messenger arrives, King soon follows
- Elisha seizes on that- watch what he says, 7.1-2
- Elisha's prophecy: food tomorrow at a good price, 2 Kings 7.1
- The captain doubts Elisha
- The issue: can God really provide for our needs? Can God really keep his word?

The Siege Lifted, 7.3-9

- Lepers discover the food.
 - Initially, they indulge themselves
 - What's the problem with that?
 - It will not keep them alive.
- Good news is for sharing.

- o Good news brings an obligation to share.
- o Given the desperation of the city (cannibalism), they want to share.
- What good does it do for us to keep the good news for ourselves and simply be consumers of the gospel?

Who does God choose to be His witnesses? 7.10-11

- They deliver the good news with a sense of urgency-during the night!
- There is an urgency to the gospel!
- People are dying without it.
- Passionate about the gospel and proclaiming the gospel so that the whole world will know of the fame of God.
- What if: when John Ryland heard William Carey talking about becoming a missionary to India, and told him, "Sit down, young man. When God decides to save the heathen, He will do it without your help."

By the way, how did it turn out? 7.12-20

- Isaiah tells us God's word does not return empty but accomplishes the purposes for which He sent it.
- How passionate are we to share the gospel- to see the vision come to pass?
