## The Wisdom Books (the poetical books)

Job, Psalms, Proverbs, Eqclesiastes, and Song of Solomon -

Job has 42 chapters, 1 verses and 10,102 words

- -Psalms has 150 chapters, 2,461 verses and 43,743 words
- -Proverbs has 31 chapters, 915 verses and 15,043 words
- -Ecclesiastes has 12 chapters, 222 verses and 5,584 words
- -Song of Solomon has 8 chapters, 117 verses, and 2,661 words

## 1. Job

- -Mentioned in Ezekiel 14:14 with Noah and Daniel, and in James 5:11
- -The book of Job sets forth five views of suffering
  - 1. The hatred of Satan is behind it ch. 1-2
  - 2. It is a puzzle to the sufferer ch. 3
  - 3. Sin must be punished ch.4-31
  - 4. Suffering purifies ch. 32-37
  - 5. It is allowed by God who rewards the faithful ch. 38-42
- -The author is believed to be Elihu (32:16 first person)
- -The key word is 1, used 333 times
- -What we learn about Satan in Job 1,2
  - -He has access to God before the throne
  - -He is aware of those being true to God and desires to destroy them
  - -He cannot act against men without divine permission
  - -He is aware that God protects his own
  - -He can't go beyond the bounds set by God
  - -He can control armies
  - -He can control the weather
  - -He can afflict the body
  - -He can kill
- -How Satan sought to destroy Job
  - -Financially
  - -Take away his comfort
  - -Isolate him (camels)
  - -Disturb him domestically
  - -Attacked his family- injure him emotionally
  - -Attacked his health

  - c. Responds to Job three times- ch. 4-5, 15, 22

#### 2. Bildad

- a. Lived in Shuah
- b. Based his beliefs on tradition and around a few wise sayings of the ancients
- c. Responds to Job three times- ch.8, 18,25

## 3. Zophar

- a. Lived in Naaman
- b. Was haughty and dogmatic
- c. Responds to Job twice-ch. 11,204. Elihu
- a. Held forth that God makes no mistakes and chastens even the righteous for their good
- b. Responds to Job one time- ch. 32-37 5. Job
- a. Responded nine times- ch. 3,6-7, 9-10, 12-14, 16-17, 19, 21, 23-24, 26-31
- 6. The Lord responded once in ch. 38-41
  - a. He asks Job 184 questions- Job can answer none of these
  - b. After the first series of questions, Job is brought to silence
  - c. After the second round, Job is brought to repentance
  - d. The questions are in groups
    - -first reveal the eternal nature of God 38:4
    - -second have to do with God's authority 38:11
    - -thirdly, whether or not God is sufficient 38:22-33
    - -fourth, questions regarding God's provision for all his creatures 39-41
    - -All one has to do to earn salvation? 40:10-14
- 7. There were three area that Job's friends failed in
  - a. They did not enter into Job's sorrow and show him sympathy
  - b. They did not allow that God was bigger than their limited view of him
  - c. They were too proud to listen to Job that he might be right
