1. Understanding the Question (v 3)

- **A.** Simple summary of the question
- **B.** The Propriety of the Question
 - **I)** We are to ask this question in faith (Psa 73:1)
 - 2) We ask this question with humble confession (Psa 73:2-3)
 - 3) We ask this question to the right person (Psa 64:1a)
- **C.** Uses from the Text
 - **1)** *Note*, This question presupposes that we are going to work nonetheless (Gen 3:17b; Dt 29:29).
 - 2) *Note*, This question presupposes that we are to persevere through our troubles (Jn 16:33)
 - 3) The answer [or lack thereof] to this question should lead us to patience (Rom 11:33-36)

11. Illustrations and Experience (vv 5-10)

- **A.** The glory of God magnified in His Word (*WCF 1.5*)
 - **I)** The heavenliness of the matter
 - 2) The majesty of style Personification and Parallels
 - 3) Use, Let us delight in God for the gift of His Word.
- **B.** Illustrations and Experience
 - **1)** Structure: There are three illustrations, three statements of experience structured in a form of mirror.
 - 2) The Laboriousness of Life (vv 5, 10)
 - **a)** The Illustration (v 5)
 - **b)** The Experience (v 10)
 - c) Use, Do we not see here the need for the Lord's Day! (Isa 58:13-14)
 - 3) The Circuity, or Repetitiveness, of Life (vv 6, 9)
 - **a)** The Illustration (v 6)
 - **b)** The Experience (v 9)
 - c) Use, We should beware claims of innovation and the fads of modernity, which are usually but old things in new dress (Jsh 6:26).
 - **4)** The Dissatisfaction of Life (vv 7, 8)
 - **a)** The Illustration (v 7)

- **b)** The Experience (v 8)
- **c)** Use, Do not set your hopes on the foolish errand of 'arriving' (Jonah 4).
- **C.** Uses from the Text
 - **1)** We ought to apply gratitude and faith from this passage (Eccl 12:13).
 - **a)** That things in life are new to us, though not intrinsically new (Lk 2:52).
 - **b)** The repetition of life is for our benefit.
 - c) Like the waters of the streams and seas, we are weary but not empty (Pr 8:29, 30:8-9; 2 Cor 4:7-10).
 - 2) Let us be contentment in the ordinary nature of life (Psa 8:3-5).
 - 3) Here we have the hope of the resurrection set before us (Rev 21:23, 22:1; Ezk 47:3-5).

111. Thesis and Summary (vv 4, 11)

- A. The Turnover Rate (v 4; 1 Cor 15:28).
- **B.** The Retention Rate (v II)
 - **1)** Here we are confronted with the sin of Babel, which we find lurking in our own hearts (Gen 11:4)
 - 2) This can be a great burden to the Church.
 - a) As when the world forgets the benefit of the presence of the Visible Church (Ex 1:8)
 - **b)** As when the Church denies or despises the faithfulness of our forefathers (Jdg 2:7)
 - 3) This can also be a great kindness to the Church that the wicked and their wickedness are forgotten on the face of the earth (Psa 109:13, 15-16)
- **C.** Uses from the Text
 - **I)** We must evaluate our hope (Mt 6:1-4; Heb 11:6)
 - 2) Let us have humility from shortness of our days (Isa 40:6-8)
 - 3) Let us be faithfulness for its own sake, not the earthly reward (Lk 17:10; Col 1:28-29)
 - 4) While there is no memorial for man, there is a perpetual memorial of Christ and His work until His return (1 Cor 11:24-25).
