## Faith that Saves & Calls Us Home

Hebrews 11:7-16

I. <u>NOAH'S FAITH</u> (7; Gen 6-9)—a picture of salvation, believing and obeying God to escape destruction

- A. Informed His Understanding (Gen 6:8-9)—He believed God's warning
  - 1. Faith influences our affections.—what we love, desire, prioritize
  - 2. Faith produces godly fear.—believes in God's judgment

## B. Compelled His Action (11:6)—

- 1. <u>Revenant Righteous Life</u>—he walked with God
- 2. <u>Specific Obedience for Salvation</u>—did what God said to be saved

**C.** <u>Condemned the World</u> (2 Pet 2:5)—Faithful witness does not always produce converts

- 1. By His Example demonstration of his faith, evidence of sincerity
  - a. Not participating in the behavior of the ungodly (Ps 1:1)
  - **b. Preparing** for the coming judgment
- 2. By His <u>Exhortation</u>—they were warned but refused to heed
  - a. Living faith should provoke questions, start conversations. (1 Pet 3:15)
  - **b.** Don't expect to fit in with the ungodly world. (Jam 4:4)
- D. Instructs Us (Mat 24:37-39)

**1.** Judgment is coming. (Ps 75; Mat 12:41-42 & 24:37-39; Jn 5:22-29; Heb 10:27; 1 Pet 4:17; Jude 1:14-15).

2. People of the world won't believe it. (2 Pet 3:3-7; Jude 1:18)

**3.** <u>Warning of judgment requires action to avoid it</u>. (Mk 1:15; Jn 6:28, 29, 40; Act 4:12 & 16:31)

- a. <u>Repent</u>—change direction, turn from worldliness and sin to God
- b. Believe in Christ—follow Him and do what He says
- **II. ABRAHAM'S FAITH** (8-13; Gen 12:1-8)—pursuing the promised inheritance
  - A. God Initiated Relationship.
    - 1. <u>Revealed</u> Himself to Abraham
    - 2. Called Abraham to do something
    - 3. <u>Promised</u> blessing to Abraham

- B. <u>Abraham Responded in Faith</u>. He believed God and acted on faith.
  - 1. Left home to follow God to a place he had never been
  - 2. Lived as a Foreigner in the Promised Land
    - a. Lived in tents—not permanent accommodations
    - b. Waited on God's timing-not "living his best life now"
- C. Sarah's Miraculous Conception (11, 12)—
  - 1. God forgives our failures and records our success!
  - 2. God's perfect faithfulness is greater than our imperfect faith.

**D.** <u>Abraham Died in Faith</u> (Jn 8:56-58)—having seen and greeted from afar the things that were promised

- 1. Faith looks beyond this life. (Job 19:26; Mk 12:26-27)
- 2. All God's promises are fulfilled in Christ. (2 Cor 1:20)
- III. <u>THE CITY OF GOD</u> (10, 13-16)—longing for home...

**A.** <u>A Better Homeland</u> (Heb 10:32-34 & 11:16)—not where we came from but where we are going; *stop letting where you came from define you!* 

Heavenly Country (1 Pet 1:4)—of God; imperishable, undefined and unfailing
Not of this World (Mat 5:5; Jn 18:36; 2 Pet 3:13; Rev 21:1)—not built by man or

granted by authority of the present system

- **B.** <u>A City with Foundations</u> (10)—solid joys and lasting treasures
  - 1. Faith provides perspective to value correctly. (1 Jn 2:17)
  - 2. Faith gives us patience to wait. (Heb 10:32-34)
- C. Prepared for us by God (16)
  - 1. God is the Author and Builder. (1 Cor 2:9; Mat 16:18)
  - 2. We are the <u>Recipients.</u> (Jn 14:2-3)

**a. We must turn from the world and follow Jesus to get there**. (Mat 8:22 & 16:24; Jn 13:36)

**b.** Home is where Jesus is. (Ps 23:6 & 90:1)

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
