<u>Heb 10.23</u> Let us hold fast the confession of our hope without wavering, for He who promised is faithful.

• The basis of our assurance is not in ourselves or our good works, but in \_\_\_\_\_ who is faithful!

<u>**1** Cor 1.9</u> God is faithful, by whom you were called into the fellowship of His Son, Jesus Christ our Lord.

Rom 3.4a Let God be true though everyone were a liar.

James 1.17 Every good gift and every perfect gift is from above, coming down from the Father of lights with whom there is no variation or shadow due to change

- Imagine what it would be like if God could change:
  - We could be saved today, but \_\_\_\_\_ tomorrow.
  - We could be loved today, but \_\_\_\_\_ tomorrow.
  - We could be received today, but \_\_\_\_\_ tomorrow.

Heb 13.8 Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and forever.

- Since God is faithful and cannot change, then it's true that:
  - If we are \_\_\_\_\_ today, we will be justified tomorrow and forever.
  - If we are in God's \_\_\_\_\_ today, no one can pluck us out tomorrow or forever.
  - If God \_\_\_\_\_\_ us with an everlasting love today, He will continue to love us tomorrow and forever.

<u>Phil 1.6</u> And I am sure of this, that He who began a good work in you will bring it to completion at the day of Jesus Christ.

Malachi 3.6a For I the LORD do not change

## B. Our assurance rests upon God's \_\_\_\_\_\_.

Heb 10.23 Let us hold fast the confession of our hope, for He who promised is faithful.

Whatever God says can be \_\_\_\_\_.

Heb 13.5 | will never leave you nor forsake you.

**John 10.27-28** My sheep hear my voice, and I know them, and they follow me. 28 I give them eternal life, and **they will never perish**, and no one will snatch them out of my hand.

**<u>Rom 8.30</u>** And those whom he predestined He also called, and those whom He called He also justified, and **those whom He justified He also glorified**.

John 17.12 I kept them in your name, which you have given Me, I have guarded them, and not one of them has been lost.

<u>Psa 103.12</u> As far as the east is from the west, so far does He remove our transgressions from us.

<u>1 John 1.9</u> If we confess our sins, **He is faithful** and **just to forgive us** our sins and to **cleanse us** from all unrighteousness.

- Those are the kinds of promises that we need to believe when we are \_\_\_\_\_ our salvation.
- God's promises tell us to \_\_\_\_\_ the forgiveness of God.
- God's promises tell us to \_\_\_\_\_ the promises of the Gospel.
- God's promises tell us to \_\_\_\_\_ in the finished work of Christ.
- God's promises are God's \_\_\_\_\_ to us when we doubt and fear.
- God does not make promises to us and then refuse to \_\_\_\_\_\_ them.

<u>2 Cor 1.19-20</u> For the Son of God, Jesus Christ, whom we proclaimed among you, Silvanus and Timothy and I, was not Yes and No, but in him it is always Yes. 20 For all the promises of God find their Yes in him. That is why it is through him that we utter our Amen to God for his glory.

 God's promises can be believed because they are rooted in His \_\_\_\_\_\_ character. <u>Heb 6.17-18</u> So when God desired to show more convincingly to the heirs of the promise the **unchangeable character** of his purpose, he **guaranteed** it with an oath, 18 so that by two unchangeable things, in which it is **impossible for God to lie**, we who have fled for refuge might have **strong encouragement** to hold fast to the hope set before us.

Heb 13.8 Jesus Christ is the same yesterday, today, and forever.

God cannot change His \_\_\_\_\_\_.

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Our assurance rests on \_\_\_\_\_ character and promises to us, not on our character or our promises to God.

C. Our assurance rests upon God's work of \_\_\_\_\_ us in Christ.

<u>2 Cor 1.21-22</u> And it is **God who establishes us** with you in Christ, and has **anointed us**, 22 and who has also **put his seal on us** and **given us His Spirit** in our hearts **as a guarantee**.

• To be established in Christ means that God has \_\_\_\_\_ us in Christ.

 $\circ$  Our acceptance before God is \_\_\_\_\_ by God's Spirit living within us.

<u>Eph 1.13–14</u> In him you also, when you heard the word of truth, the gospel of your salvation, and believed in him, were **sealed with the promised Holy Spirit**, 14 who is **the guarantee of our inheritance** until we acquire possession of it, to the praise of his glory.

 $\circ$  Our acceptance before God is the result of God's \_\_\_\_\_ work on our behalf.

**Phil 1.6** And I am sure of this, that he who began a good work in you will bring it to completion at the day of Jesus Christ.

Our eternal acceptance before God is the result of \_\_\_\_\_ work, not ours.

## **Conclusion**:

- The Word of God \_\_\_\_\_ us that we are saved.
- The assurance of our salvation does not rest upon ourselves, but upon
- Our assurance \_\_\_\_\_ upon God's character, God's promise, and God's work of establishing us in Christ.
- Remember these facts:
