- #3. The Purification Offering Nothing but the Blood (Leviticus 4)
- Focus of this passage contamination from unintentional sin
- God made provision for sin, so His people may safely enter His presence
- Sinful acts, defiled condition must be dealt with to maintain communion
- I. God Provides for Cleansing by Means of a Death Substitute: (4:3-4, 13-15, 22-24, 27-29, 32-33)
- A. All sin, known and unknown, must be forgiven
- B. Sinful defilements must be purified before participation in the sanctuary
- C. Who Could Appropriate the Purification Offering? Anyone could!
 - II. The Blood of the Substitute Provides Purification for the Sinner (4:5–7, 16–18, 25, 30, 34)
- III. God is pleased to accept the sacrifice as purification for sin (4:8–12, 19–21, 26a, 31a, 35a)
- IV. The purification offering brings atonement for forgiveness of sin (4:26b, 31b, 35b)

Concluding Observations and Application

- God will restore the sinner who appeals to Him for forgiveness on the basis of the purifying blood of the sacrifice.
- Under law everything is purified by shedding blood: without it, no forgiveness!
- . This offering highlights the seriousness of sin: even unintentional sins
- '. This offering highlights the terrible cost of sin: no blood, no forgiveness
