Ruth 2:1-3

Foreshadowing God's Provision

Conclusion: The first three verses of this second chapter open the door just a crack so that we might see the light dawning on all the gloominess that has been so difficult for Naomi and Ruth. This foreshadowing with the introduction of Boaz and Ruth finding her way to his fields helps us to begin to see how God is going to refill Naomi's emptiness and transform her bitterness into blessing. But it is also a wonderful reminder of God's faithfulness with His people. Not only does He care about each one of us individually, but He is providentially overseeing all of us together in ways that will marvelously display His matchless glory.

Leviticus 19:1-9

And the Lord spoke to Moses, saying, ² "Speak to all the congregation of the people of Israel and say to them, You shall be holy, for I the Lord your God am holy. ³ Every one of you shall revere his mother and his father, and you shall keep my Sabbaths: I am the Lord your God. ⁴ Do not turn to idols or make for yourselves any gods of cast metal: I am the Lord your God. ⁵ "When you offer a sacrifice of peace offerings to the Lord, you shall offer it so that you may be accepted. ⁶ It shall be eaten the same day you offer it or on the day after, and anything left over until the third day shall be burned up with fire. ⁷ If it is eaten at all on the third day, it is tainted; it will not be accepted, ⁸ and everyone who eats it shall bear his iniquity, because he has profaned what is holy to the Lord, and that person shall be cut off from his people. ⁹ "When you reap the harvest of your land, you shall not reap your field right up to its edge, neither shall you gather the gleanings after your harvest.

Second Thessalonians 3:6-12

"Now we command you, brothers, in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that you keep away from any brother who is *walking in idleness* and not in accord with the tradition that you received from us. ⁷ For you yourselves know how you ought to imitate us, because we were not idle when we were with you, ⁸ nor did we eat anyone's bread without paying for it, but with toil and labor we worked night and day, *that we might not be a burden to any of you*. ⁹ It was not because we do not have that right, but to give you in ourselves an example to imitate. ¹⁰ For even when we were with you, we would give you this command: *If anyone is not willing to work, let him not eat*. ¹¹ For we hear that some among you walk in idleness, not busy at work, but busybodies. ¹² Now such persons we command and encourage in the Lord Jesus Christ to do their work quietly and to earn their own living."

Psalm 135:5-6

For I know that the Lord is great, and that our Lord is above all gods. Whatever the Lord pleases, He does, in heaven and on earth, in the seas and all deeps.

Matthew 10:26-33

²⁶ "So have no fear of them, for nothing is covered that will not be revealed, or hidden that will not be known. ²⁷ What I tell you in the dark, say in the light, and what you hear whispered, proclaim on the housetops. ²⁸ And *do not fear those who kill the body but cannot kill the soul. Rather fear him who can destroy both soul and body in hell.* ²⁹ Are not two sparrows sold for a penny? And not one of them will fall to the ground apart from your Father. ³⁰ But even the hairs of your head are all numbered. ³¹ Fear not, therefore; *you are of more value than many sparrows*. ³² So everyone who acknowledges me before men, *I also will acknowledge before my Father who is in heaven*, ³³ but whoever denies me before men, I also will deny before my Father who is in heaven.

Taking Gathered Worship Home

We found Naomi and Ruth returned to Bethlehem empty and embittered. How is God going to work through them? What will He do in His faithful loving-kindness? This week He gives us a glimmer.

Please use the devotional material below each day this week to praise Christ. Ask Jesus to teach us His ways that we may walk in them to accomplish His purposes.

Sunday Morning

READ Ruth 2:1-3; Leviticus 19:1-9; Second Thessalonians 3:6-12; Psalm 135:1-21; Matthew 10:26-33. DISCUSS What is your favorite foreshadowing in literature or movies? Why do you like it? When Christ was born, Peter tells us that the angels longed to look at how He would accomplish this salvation. We get a sense of that here. MEDITATE on Leviticus 23:22. PRAY "Jesus, You are sovereign over all history, even *our* history. Help us to trust You completely."

Sunday Evening

Young Adult Fellowship meets tonight at 6pm. Pray for them.

Monday

READ Ruth 2:1-3; Leviticus 19:1-9; Psalm 104:24-33. DISCUSS How did God provide for His people in relation to eating? Can you see how this was a blessing both for the poor and the landowners? SERVE by putting someone else's interests *above your own*! MEDITATE on Leviticus 23:22. PRAY, "Father, thank You for Your gracious provision. Enable us to be truly grateful to You in all things."

Tuesday

READ Ruth 2:1-3; Second Thessalonians 3:6-12; Psalm 145:10-18. DISCUSS How is the provision in Thessalonians the same as it was in Leviticus? How is the Church (both in OT and NT) to look to God alone for all we need? How does that encourage hard work? SERVE by considering someone else's needs *above your own*! MEDITATE on Leviticus 23:22. PRAY, "Lord God, You have given us all we need. Teach us trust You in all things by obeying Your holy Word."

Wednesday

READ Ruth 2:1-3; Psalm 135:1-21; Psalm 104:24-33. DISCUSS How does God's providence free us to trust Christ? How do trust in Christ and hard work go together? SERVE by contacting someone from FCCW you haven't seen in a while. Demonstrate care for them more than yourself! MEDITATE on Leviticus 23:22. PRAY, "Lord, protect us from presumption and idleness. Renew us in faith to love You with all our energy."

Thursday

READ Ruth 2:1-3; Matthew 10:26-33; Psalm 145:10-18. DISCUSS How does knowing that God cares for us more than the sparrows help us to love one another with brotherly affection? Rejoice in God's sovereignty in all things. SERVE by putting someone else's interests *above your own*! MEDITATE on Leviticus 23:22. PRAY, "Lord, make us grateful to You for all Your blessings and to seek You more than them."

Friday

READ Ruth 2:1-3; Leviticus 19:1-9; Second Thessalonians 3:6-12; Psalm 135:1-21; Matthew 10:26-33. DISCUSS, What has the Holy Spirit been teaching you this week through these passages? MEDITATE on Leviticus 23:22. PRAY that we at FCCW would *rejoice in God's good providence*.

Saturday

PREPARE for gathered worship tomorrow. READ Ruth 2:1-23. Invite others to join you tomorrow for the worship service @ 10:30. Ask Jesus to help us trust Him instead of giving into bitterness and doubt.
