Introduction to the Course

What is God's will concerning *how* believers are to grow?

Love and Serve One Another - Primary text: Philippians 2:1-4

So if there is any encouragement in Christ, any comfort from love, any participation in the Spirit, any affection and sympathy, 2 complete my joy by being of the same mind, having the same love, being in full accord and of one mind. 3 Do nothing from selfish ambition or conceit, but in humility count others more significant than yourselves. 4 Let each of you look not only to his own interests, but also to the interests of others. (Philippians 2:1-4)

16 times in the NT, the command is found: "Love one another." But what does that look like?

Because Christ put the need of sinners in front of his own, believers ought to consider others better than themselves. This class deals with the heart attitude: others first, pride must die.

"This is how we know what love is: Jesus Christ laid down his life for us." (1 John 3:16)

The "One Anothers" about Loving and Serving

A new commandment I give to you, that you <u>love</u> one another: just as I have loved you, you also are to <u>love</u> one another. 35 By this all people will know that you are my disciples, if you have <u>love</u> for one another." (John 13:34-35)

<u>Love</u> one another with brotherly affection. Outdo one another in <u>showing honor</u>. (Romans 12:10)

For you were called to freedom, brothers. Only do not use your freedom as an opportunity for the flesh, but through love <u>serve</u> one another. 14 For the whole law is fulfilled in one word: "You shall love your neighbor as yourself." (Galatians 5:13-14)

with all humility and gentleness, with patience, <u>bearing with</u> one another in love (Ephesians 4:2)

Put on then, as God's chosen ones, holy and beloved, compassionate hearts, kindness, humility, meekness, and patience, 13 <u>bearing with one another</u> and, if one has a complaint against another, forgiving each other; as the Lord has forgiven you, so you also must forgive. (Colossians 3:12-13)

<u>Be kind</u> to one another, tenderhearted, <u>forgiving</u> one another, as God in Christ forgave you. (Ephesians 4:32)

Above all, <u>keep loving</u> one another earnestly, since love covers a multitude of sins. 9 <u>Show</u> <u>hospitality</u> to one another without grumbling. (1 Peter 4:8-9)

Clothe yourselves, all of you, with <u>humility</u> toward one another, for "God opposes the proud but gives grace to the humble." (1 Peter 5:5)

Biblical Illustration: The Gospel of Jesus Christ

Have this mind among yourselves, which is yours in Christ Jesus, 6 who, though he was in the form of God, did not count equality with God a thing to be grasped, 7 but emptied himself, by taking the form of a servant, being born in the likeness of men. 8 And being found in human form, he humbled himself by becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross (Philippians 2:5-8)

Applications

- 1. Put selfishness and pride to death by fixing your eyes on Christ *daily*.
- 2. Treasure the gospel to apprehend God's love *for you*.
- 3. Let 1 Corinthians 13 be a guide to assess your love for others, asking probing questions:

If I speak in the tongues of men and of angels, but have not love, I am a noisy gong or a clanging cymbal. 2 And if I have prophetic powers, and understand all mysteries and all knowledge, and if I have all faith, so as to remove mountains, but have not love, I am nothing. 3 If I give away all I have, and if I deliver up my body to be burned, but have not love, I gain nothing.

4 Love is patient and kind; love does not envy or boast; it is not arrogant 5 or rude. It does not insist on its own way; it is not irritable or resentful; 6 it does not rejoice at wrongdoing, but rejoices with the truth. 7 Love bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things. (1 Corinthians 13:1-7)

Do I value gifts and talents over love for others? (v1-2) Do I sacrifice without love? (v3) Am I patient and kind? (v4) Do I envy or boast, or am I arrogant or rude? (v4-5) Do I insist on my way? (v5) Am I irritable or resentful? (v6) Do I rejoice at wrongdoing, or rejoice with truth? (v6) Do I dwell on the positive or negative in people? (v7)
