"THE CHURCH GOD USES"

I Thessalonians 1:1-10

<u>MAIN IDEA:</u> The church that God uses is one which looks in four different directions.

An Outline of I Thessalonians:

- I. PAUL'S LOOK AT HIS COMING (1:1-2:16)
 - A. The Remembrance of His Converts (1:1-10): the picture of a model church

I. THE CHURCH WITH A BACKWARD VIEW (I Thess. 1:1-7)

The backward view results in a memory of the past.

- A. We need to be remembered for our godly character (1:1-4).
- B. We need to remember when the gospel was preached to us (1:5).
- C. We need to remember when the gospel was received by us (1:6).
- D. We need to remember when the gospel changed our lives (1:7).

II. THE CHURCH WITH AN OUTWARD VIEW (I Thess. 1:8-9a)

The outward view results in a message for the world.

- A. The proclamation of the gospel resulted directly from the changed lives of the believers (1:8-9a).
- B. The proclamation of the gospel resulted also from the words spoken by the converts (cp. 1:5; Acts 17:1-4).

III. THE CHURCH WITH A FORWARD VIEW (I Thess. 1:9b)

The forward view results in a ministry to God.

- A. In the past we served idols.
- B. When we received Christ, we began to serve the living God (cp. Rom. 6:19-22).

IV. THE CHURCH WITH AN UPWARD VIEW (I Thess. 1:10)

The upward view results in a motivation for the present.

- A. We must await the return of Jesus Christ in the future (1:10).
- B. The expectation of His coming ought to change us in the present (cp. Tit. 2:11-13; I John 3:2-3).

What is true of the local church is also true of the individual believer.

- Are you looking backward, praising God for what He has done in your life?
- Are you looking outward, seeking to reach the lost with the gospel of Christ?
- Are you looking forward, faithfully serving the living God?
- Are you looking upward, eagerly anticipating His return at any moment?
