WISDOM

Ephesians 5:15-21

- I. <u>LIVE WISELY</u> (15)—Christian wisdom is practical, teaches how to live
 - A. <u>Consider Carefully</u>—intentionally notice, pay attention
 - 1. Know your goal. destination, target—what are you aiming for?
 - 2. Give thought and planning. —to make progress in the right direction
 - **3. Evaluate and make adjustments along the way.** Am I still on track, going in the right direction?
 - **B.** How You Walk (Ps 4:4; Ps 119:59; 139:23-24; Lam 3:40)—the way you live, worthy of calling as a Christian?
 - **1. Examine** <u>yourself.</u>— (Ps 4:4; 119:59; Mat 7:5; Rom 12:3;) —focus on what *you* are doing and what *you* should be doing better.
 - **2. Examine your <u>behavior patterns</u>.** (Ps 139:23-24; Pro 4:19, 25-27; Gal 6:3-4; Jam 3:2)—not just intentions
 - a. View yourself accurately. (Ps 36:2; Rom 12:3; Gal 6:3)—humility
 - **b. Ask God to show you.** (Ps 139:23-24)
 - c. Seek out and accept counsel. (Ps 141:5)—mentor, coach
 - C. Not as Unwise but as Wise (Ps 111:10; Pro 3:13-18; 9:10; Hos 14:9; Jam 1:5)
 - 1. Wisdom is practical. —apply understanding of reality to live well
 - 2. Wisdom is moral.—not just smart or stupid; also right or wrong
 - 3. God is the source of wisdom.— He designed & created everything
- **II. USING TIME** (16-17)—making the most of every opportunity
 - **A. Evil Days** Understand the times in which we are living
 - **1. Life is short**. (Ps 90:12)
 - **2.** The world is broken. (1 Cor 7:26, 29-31)
 - **3. We are at war.** (Jer 45:4-5; 2 Tim 2:3-7)
 - B. The Best Use of Time
 - C. <u>Understanding the Lord's Will</u> (Rom 12:2; Mat 6:33)
 - 1. General vs. Specific—apply general will of God (scripture) to specific situation
 - 2. Permissible vs. Beneficial (1 Cor 6:12; 10:23)—Good is often the enemy of Best

- **III. SPIRITS** (Act 2:)—alcohol; under the influence of what spirit?
 - **A.** Not Drunk With Wine (Ps 104:15; Pro 31:4-7; Ecc 9:7; Isa 28:7; 1 Tim 4:4-5 & 5:23;)— a huge part of pagan culture
 - 1. <u>Alcohol</u> is not Forbidden. —a gift to be used responsibly
 - 2. <u>Drunkenness</u> is inappropriate (Isa 5:11-12) for Christians.
 - **a. Bad Judgment**—(Prov 31:4-5; Hos 4:11)
 - **b. Lack of self-control**—(Prov 23:29-35; 25:28)
 - **b. Debauchery—**(Prov 23: 20-21)—excessive, unhealthy, unrestrained indulgence in all sorts of sensual pleasures
 - B. But Filled with the Spirit
 - 1. **Continual Filling**—not a one-time event; continually replenishing
 - 2. The Holy Spirit (Isa 11:2; Act 6:3; Gal 5:23)—not old nature of fleshly lust
 - a. Good Judgment
 - b. Self Control
 - c. Other Virtues
- **IV.** MUSIC (Job 38:7; Prov 29:6; Jam 5:13;)—
 - **A.** Variety of Musical Expression (Ps 33:3; 40:3; 98:1, 4-6; 149:1-6;)
 - 1. Psalms, Hymns, Spiritual Songs—various styles, old & new songs
 - 2. Singing & Making Melody—music and song
 - **B.** To Whom—audience, recipient of the communication
 - 1. One Another (1 Thes 5:11)—encourage, inspire, instruct, remind
 - **2. The Lord** (Ps 92:1-3; 95:2; 147:1)—directly to the Lord, for Him
 - C. With the Heart (Ps 108:1; Lk 6:45)—heart is engaged, not an empty form
- V. GIVING THANKS (Ps 9:1; 100:4; Ps 107; Phil 4:4-6;n Col 3:17; 1 Thes 5:16-18)—
 - A. Always —God is always worthy of praise, no matter what is going on
 - **B.** For Everything (Rom 8:28; Phil 4:6; 1 Thes 5:18)—God is sovereign
 - C. <u>To God the Father</u> (Jam 1:17)—source of goodness & blessing
 - **D.** In the Name of our Lord Jesus Christ (Col 3:17)—all that we do
