Sermon: **2Corinthians 4:7**

God put the treasure of the Gospel in "earthen vessels" so that it would be obvious that the power of the Gospel is from God alone.

We see:

1. The treasure is the ministry of the Gospel, through which one is transformed out of death to eternal life.
2. This treasure God placed in "earthen vessels" (those who were also dead in sin but have been transformed, and yet have many weaknesses and struggles).
3. God placed this treasure in man so that it would be obvious that the power of the Gospel is His work and not man's.

Chapter 30—Of Church Censures

WCF 30.1 The Lord Jesus, as King and Head of His Church, hath therein appointed government, in the hand of Church officers, distinct from the civil magistrate.(1)

WCF 30.2 To these officers the keys of the kingdom of heaven are committed, by virtue whereof, they have power, respectively, to retain, and remit sins; to shut that kingdom against the impenitent, both by the Word, and censures; and to open it unto penitent sinners, by the ministry of the Gospel; and by absolution from censures, an occasion shall require.(1)

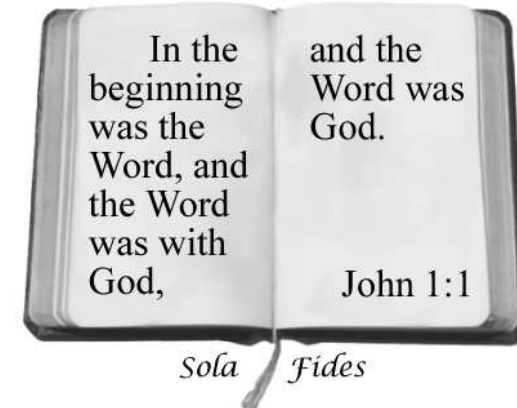
