## I. THE GLORY OF THE HOLY SPIRIT'S SAVING WORKS

- A. Though the Spirit is a Comforter, He typically does not begin with comfort
- B. Examine Jesus' teaching in John 3:1-8
  - 1. Who is visiting Jesus?
    - a. Nicodemus was a man of honor yet not born again (vs. 3, 7)

b. Nicodemus was a man of learning yet ignorant of new birth (vs. 4, 9)

c. Nicodemus was man with conviction yet unsaved (vs. 2)

- 2. What are these few observations doing to you?
  - a. They ought to cause you to cry to God (Ps. 19:13-15; 26:2; 139:23-24)
  - b. They must make us cautious to conclude all is well spiritually (Matt 7:15-23; 2 Cor. 13:5)

- C. What is Jesus' teaching John 3:3-8?
  - 1. Jesus tells we need something outside our ability to do (Eph. 1:19-20)
  - 2. Jesus tells new birth is an absolutely needed
    - a. why cannot we be part of His Kingdom without the new birth?
    - b. meditate through Matt. 15:19; Eccl. 8:11; 9:3; Phil. 3:4-6; Titus 3:3

**Living these truths:** What now? What will you do with Jesus' teaching? A. Do you despair of being saved for it is out of your reach?

- B. Do you asking for real, "What must I do to be saved?"
  - 1. Seek specifically for His Spirit in prayer:
    - Lam. 5:21 Turn Thou us unto Thee, O LORD, and we shall be turned.
    - Ps. 51:10 Create in me a clean heart, O God; and renew a right spirit within me.
  - 2. Place yourself where the Spirit works:
    - 1 Thess. 5:19-20 Quench not the Spirit. Despise not prophesyings.
  - 3. Honor the Spirit when He calls
    - Proverb 1:23: Turn you at my reproof: behold, I will pour out my spirit upon you, I will make know my words unto you.
    - Is. 63:10: But they rebelled, and vexed His holy Spirit: therefore He was turned to be their enemy, and He fought against them
