Every relationship is defined by boundaries - proper behavior - and our relationship with God is no different. God graciously gives us directions on how to live well in the world He has made.

Mark 12:28-34 ESV

And one of the scribes came up and heard them disputing with one another, and seeing that he answered them well, asked him, "Which commandment is the most important of all?" ²⁹ Jesus answered, "The most important is, 'Hear, O Israel:The Lord our God, the Lord is one. ³⁰ And you shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind and with all your strength.' ³¹ The second is this: 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.' There is no other commandment greater than these.' ³² And the scribe said to him, "You are right, Teacher. You have truly said that he is one, and there is no other besides him. ³³ And to love him with all the heart and with all the understanding and with all the strength, and to love one's neighbor as oneself, is much more than all whole burnt offerings and sacrifices." ³⁴ And when Jesus saw that he answered wisely, he said to him, "You are not far from the kingdom of God." And after that no one dared to ask him any more questions.

Corporate Confession of Sin

If we rightly know ourselves, as soon as we come in to the presence of a holy God we realize our own deep sinfulness and need for a savior. We confess together to remind ourselves and those around us that we must approach God with honesty, and that none of us is alone in our sin.

Almighty and Most Merciful Father, we have erred and strayed from your ways like lost sheep. We have followed too much the devices and desires of our own hearts. We have offended against your holy law. We have left undone those things which we ought to have done, and we have done those things which we ought not to have done, and there is no health in us. Oh Lord, have mercy upon us, miserable offenders. Spare those, oh God, who confess their sin, and restore those who are penitent, according to your promises

declared to us in Jesus Christ our Lord. And grant, oh most merciful Father, for His sake, that we may hereafter live a Godly, righteous, and sober life, to the glory of Your holy name. Amen.

Assurance of Pardoning Grace

Distribution of Elements

Because we believe that wine was used in the Last Supper and is thus more in accord with the fullness of symbolism intended by God in the Lord's Supper, we offer and encourage wine for those who take part in Communion. For those with conscientious convictions against the use of wine, however, we offer grape juice, which is contained in the inner circle of the communion trays. The cups containing wine are in the outer circles.
