The Destructiveness of Negativity James 5:9

Complaining is:

I. Habitual – "Grudge not (Stop Complaining)"
Our murmuring is:

A. Witnessed — " one against another "
John McEnroe
Bobby Knight

- **B.** Willful "Grudge not "
- **C. Worrisome** "ye be condemned"

II. Hurtful - "against another; lest you be judged"

Our murmuring harms:

A. Others – "one against another "Directed at those who are closestest/helpful...Even Jesus was murmured against John 7:12

B. Ourselves – "lest ye be condemned" What Goes around comes around – (James 2:13)

C. Outsiders – "the judge stands before the door"

III. Honorless- "the judge standeth at the door"

Our murmuring fails to recognize the Lord's:

- **A. Presence** "Behold...at the door "
- **B.** Position "the Judge "

C. Performance – "stands before the door"

The themes of God's will, Proper Speech, and dealing with difficulty are front and center.

Different Versions King James Version

Grudge not one against another, brethren, lest ye be condemned: behold the judge stands before the door.

The New Life translation:

Do not complain about each other, Christian brothers. Then you will not be judged. See! The judge is standing at the door.

NIV

Don't grumble against each other, brothers, or you will be judged. The Judge is standing at the door.

God's Word Translation

Brothers and sisters, stop complaining about each other, or you will be condemned. Realize that the judge is standing at the door.

EXEGESIS

- Grudge = "stenazete"- groaning, muttering, grumbling or whining. Word order literally "stop whining" Contrast this with verse 7 "be patient"
- Not = "mey" to calls for a discontinuing or to Quit doing what you are doing...don't let this become a habit.
- One against another =
- Brethren = brothers and sisters (word order for this verse is Don't Whine brothers and sisters ...against one another.
- Behold = to see something right in front of you.
- Lest = in order that ...not
- Ye be condemned = severe censure
- Behold = Look at the reality right in front of you.
- The judge = the one whose job is to judge
- Stands = (intensive perfect) Jesus continually stands ready to carry out judgment...his return is imminent.
- Before the door = behind the door, we can not see Him but just as anyone standing on the other side of a door...He is still there and will soon enter.
