Ephesians 4:1-5

- ¹ I therefore, a prisoner for the Lord, urge you to walk in a manner worthy of the calling to which you have been called,
- ² with all humility and gentleness, with patience, bearing with one another in love,
- ³ eager to maintain the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace.
- ⁴ There is one body and one Spirit-- just as you were called to the one hope that belongs to your call--
- ⁵ one Lord, one faith, one baptism...

E Pluribus Unum

- Out of many, Jesus is making one church
 - out of every tribe, language, people, nation
 - out of every era of human history
- ❖ God's priority for His people is that they be one (*cf.* John 17:20-21)
 - our oneness highlights the reality and validity of Jesus' rescue mission
 - our oneness is meant to reflect the same quality of relationship as the one that exists within the Trinity
- Jesus' church is a living, breathing, divinely created, divinely empowered organism

One

- ❖ There are 7 "ones" in vv. 4-6
 - 7 essential characteristics that make a church a church
 - all churches that are rightly related to God through the truth He reveals about Himself in His Word, hold these seven things in common

❖ One body

- the question is not how many denominations, how many congregations, or how many countries
- all true believers belong to the same body

* One Spirit

- everyone who belongs to Jesus possesses the exact same Spirit (*cf.* Ephesians 2:22)
- we are called to listen to the Spirit and respond to Him with obedience

One hope

- the Holy Spirit unites us with a common hope
- we have a shared destiny, we are all going to the same place

One Lord

- are there different Lords for different people? (*cf.* Acts 4:12)
- there is only one way to God and that is through the one Lord, Jesus Christ

One faith

- the content of our faith is revealed in God's Word
- Jude 1:3, the faith that was once for all delivered to the saints.

♦ One baptism

- baptism doesn't confer salvation
- it is an indication and a public testimony that Jesus has moved in on a life

One God and Father of all

- *The LORD our God, the LORD is one.* (Deut. 6:4)
- everyone who belongs to God through the ministry of the Holy Spirit by faith in Jesus Christ is God created, God loved, and God fathered

Maintain the Unity

- ❖ We do not create/manufacture unity
 - unity is a given
 - we are called to maintain the unity by "staying in tune" with Jesus who then keeps us "in tune" with one another
- ❖ To stay "in tune" with Jesus we must walk in a manner worthy of the calling to which we have been called
- We must walk with

■ total humility

• this is a command, not a suggestion

- understand the vast difference that exists between a sovereign, infinite, eternal, holy, omnipotent God and we who are finite, fragile, and stained by sin
- **gentleness** (or meekness)
 - a quiet, willing submission to God and to others
 - power under control (horse and bridle)

patience

- not blowing up or having a "short fuse"
- John Bunyan, "He is lying down need fear no fall."

■ bearing with one another in love

- Philippians 2:3-4
- a love that has room for failure in it
- "Walking worthy" lies at the heart of our witness
 - evangelism is not a program or a method, it is a lifestyle
 - when others see these qualities on display in our lives, they will start asking questions
